Your chance to board largest **Viking longship**


THE world's largest reconstructed Viking longboat is set to go on show to the public in a series of open days next week - once mast repairs have been completed.

The Draken Harald Harfagre is currently moored at Liverpool **Victoria Rowing** Club, West Float, **Wallasey after** arriving last Thursday.

It has been undergoing repairs after its mast

snapped on the vovage from Norway. The mast is due to be repaired today and once completed the club hopes to announce a series of open days next week when the public can board the ship.
