International Year in Europe (Erasmus)

Eligibility

Open to BSc Plant Science. Apply in first year to study abroad for full third year, extending the degree to a four year programme and updating the degree title to "...with an International Year".

All students must take and pass 20 credits of language modules during year 2 (10 credits in each semester).

Students on the foreign language option must have a GCSE or equivalent in the host language (minimum Grade B) at application stage. Students on the foreign language option will take the majority of modules abroad in the target language (French, Spanish or German). Please note that some of our partner universities have minimum language requirements.

Depending on your subject and language, it may be possible to study abroad in English if you have no prior knowledge of the host language. Depending on your language competency and academic attainment during semester 1, it may be possible for you to work abroad in the host country for the second semester of the International Year.
