- Organize the year's programme once abstracts have been received.
- Liaise with the series lecturers once the programme has been set up.
- Find artwork for the posters used to promote the series and its individual lectures and contact artists to obtain authorisation to use their work.
- Liaise with the University Design Team to create posters for the Popular Culture Lecture series
- Create the different posters used to advertise the series and its individual lectures.
- Promote the series on social media and update its online presence, both on Facebook and Twitter.
- Liaise with lecturers and other members of the University to advertise the lectures both within and outside the University.
- Organize external events, such as public readings, Q&A sessions with authors or academics, etc.
- Introduce each weekly lecture and lecturer and chair the Q&A session at the end of each lecture.

Most of the work is carried out in the Autumn term and during the first month of the lecture series. Following this, the series requires weekly updates that should not take up more than a few minutes of your time each day. Attendance at the lecture every Wednesday between 5:30pm and 7pm is required.
