NUBS China, based at the University of Nottingham Ningbo, China is an integral part of Nottingham University Business School, one of the UK's leading centres of management education and research. The School conducts world-class research and offers a wide range of programmes at campuses in China, Malaysia as well as in Singapore.

The School's *International Centre for Behavioural Business Research* brings together researchers from a range of disciplines who share an interest in understanding business and economic issues in terms of decision making, especially from a psychological perspective. We actively seek engagement with other researchers, business and public organisations internationally to collaborate and share findings to inform business and public policy.

In order to further enhance the Centre's growing profile and international collaborations, ICBBR seeks to invite visiting fellows to spend a period of two to four months at the China Campus in Ningbo to carry out projects in any area of behavioural business research. Applicants should have a record of publications and current programme of research in this area. Applications by individuals with ongoing projects related to Chinese culture and/or psychology, and those involving experimental techniques are particularly welcome. Successful applicants will be expected to engage in the research culture of the Centre, including participation in meetings and seminars, and in the research dialogue among members.

While the fellowships are not remunerated, NUBS China will provide office facilities and standard administrative and IT support. The fellowships are open with the period 1 October 2009 and 1 February 2010 subject to negotiation. The University campus contains hotel, shopping and restaurant facilities available to the successful applicants at standard rates. Applicants should be able to fund travel, accommodation and subsistence independently.
