**Understanding Module Credits**

180 credits are required for the award of Executive MSc in Global Supply Chain Management.  
 120 credits are awarded for passes in taught modules and/or the Supply Chain Group Project.  
 90 credits of compulsory taught modules are required, as listed above.  
 All taught modules are worth 10 credits.  
 A total of 30 credits of elective modules are required.  
 Elective modules will be offered according to demand.  
 The Supply Chain Group Project is worth 20 credits. It is classified as an elective and can replace two taught elective modules.  
 Suitable modules passed at other Universities will be considered for Accredited Prior Learning credits on a case-by-case basis.  
 60 credits are awarded for the successful completion of the Dissertation.  
 The Executive MBA Business and Commercial Law module is a compulsory elective module should you wish to gain MCIPS. You also have the opportunity to study the Executive MBA Strategies in CSR and Business Ethics modules as electives as part of the Executive MSc GSCM programme.  
 For 2011/12 academic year, the Board of Examiners are provisionally scheduled to meet to ratify module marks w/c 31st October 2011, w/c 6th February 2012 and w/c 11 June 2012.
