Professor Yao is ranked in the world's top 10 Chinese scholars specialising in the country's economy. He is also co-ordinator of the *China and the World Economy* programme at the Globalisation and Economic Policy Centre and has a wide range of consultancy experience for major international organisations, including UNDP, the World Bank, the EU and UNCDF.

A graduate in Chinese and Linguistics and fluent in Mandarin, Richard was based in Beijing as Reuters' Manager for China, Mongolia and North Korea from 1994 to 1998. He also spent four years in Tokyo as President of Reuters Japan before being seconded to UK Trade and Investment's China Markets Unit to advise British firms on doing business in China.

Areas of specialisation include long-term economic growth; income and health disparities; management practices among local and foreign firms; urbanisation; economic and business history of China in the 19th and 20th centuries.

Dr Morgan has been involved with China for more than 30 years as a student, academic and foreign correspondent. He was a China-based contributor to the *South China Morning Post* (1982–1985) and assistant political and business editor of the *Far Eastern Economic Review* (1987–90) before spending many years as a Senior Lecturer in Asian Economic History.

Although his availability can be limited by his involvement in other aspects of the School, Dr Morgan's background in journalism makes him an ideal commentator for the English media.

Dr Berg studied Sinology in Munich, Shanghai, Taipei, Oxford, Tokyo and Kyoto and in 1995 earned a doctorate in Ming/Qing popular culture and cultural history from Oxford University. 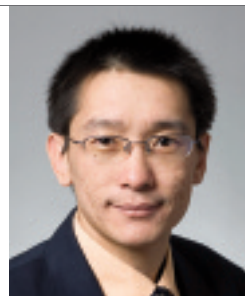
