The conference takes place on 23rd and 24th June 2016 (see conference programme for timings). The conference setting, Attingham Park, is in a rural location so please be aware that accommodation locally is booking quickly for the conference dates. A useful link for accommodation is <u>booking.com</u> or there is a <u>Holiday Inn Express</u> located 3 miles from Attingham (01743 276020).

The gala dinner is being held at 6.30pm for 7pm, at the <u>Corbet Arms</u> Uffington, Shrewsbury SY4 4SN, which is just under 3 miles from Attingham.

Please note that most accommodation and the Gala Dinner on Thursday 23rd June will require access via either your own vehicle or taxi. If you do not have your own vehicle and would like to car share to the Gala Dinner, please let us know at Registration and we will be happy to assist with organising this where possible. The conference delegate fee includes entry to Attingham but we would be extremely grateful if those with National Trust membership could show their card at Visitor Reception upon arrival.

Volunteers will be on hand to greet and help orientate you from 10am until registration at 1pm. Please be aware there is a 10 minute walk between Visitor Reception and the Mansion where Pre-Conference Tours, Registration and the Conference itself are taking place, so allow enough time for arrival.
