	You will create a welcoming student profile page for yourself on Unibuddy. You will aim to respond to any questions received through the platform within a 48-hour period.	
Rate of pay:	£10.42 per hour	
Location:	Online	
Frequency:	We will pay you for 15 minutes each week. This is the average amount of time that a Unibuddy ambassador spends on the platform. You may work slightly more or less than 15 minutes each week, but we will pay you this set amount either way.

#### Time commitment

You must be available to respond regularly to prospective student questions through the Unibuddy platform. Often, this will be through the Unibuddy app on your personal smartphone.

The frequency of hours is between 0 to 2 hours each week, depending on the number of questions that you receive. The average amount of time that a Unibuddy ambassador spends on the platform is around 15 minutes. You may work slightly more or less than 15 minutes each week, but we will pay you this set amount either way.

This role will include some work outside of university term-time. There will also be a 2 week break over Christmas 2023 and during the UCAS embargo period in August 2024.

#### **Professional conduct**

You will be expected to represent the University of Nottingham whilst working within this role. It will be essential for you to comply with university policies related to CMA, data protection, and safeguarding. To enable this, you will be required to read a short training document before you begin the role.
