Anticipating possible questions:

When rereading the thesis

When rereading Educational Research (Woods and Smith, 2016)

Using the Vivacards (vivacards.co.uk)

I also:

Had a supervision session devoted to discussing the viva and my preparation

Discussed the viva with an academic contact at another university:

"Where's the new knowledge?"

The viva itself:

Was two hours long

A stimulating professional conversation

Very firmly focussed on my research/my thesis

My main supervisor sat in and took notes

Some of the questions asked:

Why this topic?

Why these specific research questions?

Why did you order the presentation of your six cases in this way? What difference would it have made if you had chosen an alternative sequence?

Why did you choose to focus on role theory? How did you decide which literature to include/leave out?

Some of the questions asked:

Talk about your sampling: why these six?
Talk about your methodology/methods/
coding process. Discuss and justify the choices
you made.

Is there anything you would change were you to rewrite the Discussion chapter?

Discuss the clear connection between the literature and your data in the Discussion chapter. (This needed to be stronger.)

The candidate offered an excellent defence of the thesis and responded effectively to the the issues raised by the examiners.

Recommendation: Award with minor revisions to be completed within three months

Minor revisions to be approved by Professor Tony Bush (Internal Examiner)

- Review the title of chapter 2. Mapping the field: A literature review of transition into headship
- 2. P12. Remove or substantiate the claim re headteacher shortages
- 3. Expand the explanation of sampling processes, including how final decisions were made
- 4. Add a section on 'additional data collection' after section on semistructured interviews (top of p. 43)
- Add a summary table highlighting the quantity of data collected e.g. Robert 15 hrs semi structured interviews
- 6. Move 'Processing the data' (and change to 'Data Analysis') from p. 53 to before 'My position...'
- 7. Enhance the use of literature and be bolder in chapter 5
- 8. Be explicit about the significance/ contribution of your work and offer some implications for future research, policy and practice.
