ESRC PhD Studentships in Geography

The School of Geography invites applications from suitably qualified students for fully-funded (fees and maintenance) University of Nottingham ESRC PhD studentships. Applications may be made in any area relevant to the School's ESRC-related research themes in Cultural and Historical Geography, Environment and Society, Geosciences and New Economic Geographies/Economic Worlds. All students must fulfil relevant ESRC eligibility criteria. Studentships are available only to students from the UK and the EU, due to funding restrictions. Training pathways are offered on a 1+3, 2+3 and 2+2 basis through the School's Masters courses: MSc Economy, Space and Society; MSc Environmental History; MA/MSc Environmental Management; MSc Financial Services and Society; MSc Geographical Information Science; MSc Human Geography; MSc Human Geography and Chinese Studies; MA Landscape and Culture; MRes Contaminated Land Management; and MRes Geospatial Intelligence. Alternatively, studentships may be awarded on a +3 basis to suitably qualified students.

Studentships will commence in October 2012.
