



STUDY ABROAD & INTERNATIONAL EXCHANGE PROGRAMME APPLICATION GUIDELINES 2009/2010

ELIGIBILITY

Students must have completed at least one year of study at their home university in order to participate in the programme.

Students applying as part of the International Exchange Programme must be studying at a university that has a current bilateral agreement with Nottingham. Applications must be submitted via the home institution.

Students who are applying for the Study Abroad Programme can do so directly to the University of Nottingham or through their home university or a provider.

DEADLINES

Applications are processed on a rolling basis, which means that the earlier the application is received, the sooner it is processed. It is recommended that applications are submitted as early as possible. The deadline for an academic programme starting in September 2009 is **May 31 2009** and **November 30 2009** for a January 2010 programme.

All applications for students wishing to study modules in the **School of English Studies** and the **Business School** should be submitted by the **May 31 2009** deadline for the Autumn Semester, the Full Academic Year and the Spring Semester.

Your Home University is where you are currently studying. Students applying for the Autumn Semester: should note that **this finishes at the end of January**. All students are expected to stay in Nottingham until the end of the semester and take their exams in Nottingham in January.

- Undergraduate modules are graded at levels 1,2,3 or A,B,C:

Level A modules are designed for first and second-year students
Level 2 modules are designed for second-year students
Level B modules are designed for second and third-year students
Level 3 and C modules are designed for third/final-year students
Level 4, 5 and D modules are designed for postgraduate students
- Modules marked 'Available to Study Abroad/JYA/Erasmus' are particularly suitable.
- Final year modules are not always available and postgraduate modules are usually unavailable.

PLEASE NOTE: - Incoming Exchange students are exempt from paying any tuition fees to The University of Nottingham.

LIVING COSTS

The University of Nottingham estimates that for 2009/10 £700 per month will be required for a single student to cover living costs. This figure includes accommodation, subsistence, clothing, books, some entertainment and internal travel. It does not include the international airfare. Students should ensure that they are aware of any additional expenses,

ACCOMMODATION

- University accommodation is guaranteed to all Study Abroad/International Exchange students who apply by the accommodation deadline, which is specified in the offer letter.
- There is an online application form for university-allocated accommodation.
- The type of accommodation available ranges from traditional catered halls of residence on campus to self-catered accommodation in shared flats close to the University.
- The price of accommodation varies depending on the type of room.
- Students who apply for university accommodation will be charged until the end of their selected study period regardless of their departure date from Nottingham.
- Students are advised to check the dates of their accommodation contract before signing.
- It is possible to apply for university-allocated accommodation for one semester.
- Unfortunately the room type requested cannot be guaranteed.

ENGLISH LANGUAGE REQUIREMENTS

Those students who do not study in an English-speaking country must submit evidence of English Language proficiency with either an IELTS or TOEFL certificate. Please indicate your score and the date it was received on the application form. Please note that The University of Nottingham does not accept institutional English language scores.

Pre-sessional English language courses are offered by the University's Centre for English Language Education (CELE) for students who do not meet the minimum English language requirements. Course lengths and start dates are set by CELE and The University of Nottingham reserves the right to determine the minimum length of pre-sessional course you will need in order to meet our English language requirements.

Students must apply for all pre-sessional courses on the Study Abroad & Exchange Programme application form, not directly to CELE. You will find the tuition fees for the Study Abroad Programme on page two, please note this does not include any fees from our Centre for English Language Education should you be required to attend. Minimum English language requirements for direct entry:

For students taking modules from Schools in the Faculties of Arts, Law and Social Sciences (including the Schools of Mathematics, Psychology and Pharmacy):

- IELTS 6.5 (no less than 6.0 in any element)
- TOEFL 573 Paper based (TWE minimum of 4.5) / 230 Computer based (Essay rating minimum of 4.5) / 88 IBT (minimum 19 in any element)

For students taking modules from Schools in the Faculties of Science and Engineering (excluding the Schools of Mathematics, Psychology and Pharmacy):

- IELTS 6.0 (no less than 5.0 in any element)
- TOEFL 550 Paper based (no less than 4.0 in TWE) / 213 Computer based (no less than 4.0 in essay rating) / 79 IBT (minimum 17 in any element)

Please note that the University of Nottingham does not accept institutional English language scores.

- If applying to study Architecture in the School of the Built Environment, please enclose a portfolio of your recent work on CD (see our website for further information)
- An official nomination letter from your home university. All applicants from International Exchange partner universities must be officially nominated by their home university .
