

eLibrary Gateway: Accessing Subject Resources

Introduction: What is the eLibrary Gateway?

The eLibrary Gateway is a single interface via which all members of The University of Nottingham can access electronic resources relevant to their subjects. These resources include:

- major bibliographic databases used to locate journal articles
- library catalogues
- internet gateways
- collections of electronic journals and electronic books

The gateway enables you to search several databases simultaneously, linking directly through to the full text of articles where available, or to the Nottingham University Library holdings of journals and texts.

You can personalise the settings on the gateway, create lists of your favourite databases and e-journals and retain collections of retrieved references.

Where do I access the eLibrary Gateway?

Go directly to www.nottingham.ac.uk/elibrarygateway or use the Intranet Portal my.nottingham.ac.uk select the **Library** tab and launch **eLibrary Gateway**.

What do I need to access the eLibrary Gateway?

You need the username and password that you use to log in to any campus-based computer. You should use this to login to the eLibrary Gateway.

Many resources do not require a login, and most that do will accept the local University username and password. If presented with an Athens login prompt you should click on **Alternative Login** (see below).

Then search for **University of Nottingham** and follow the links to reach the local login site.

Organisations that use Athens access management

To find out if your organisation uses Athens or to log in at your home organisation using AthensDA or Shibboleth, enter your organisation name in the search box or find it on the list below. If your organisation is not listed, it does not yet use Athens.

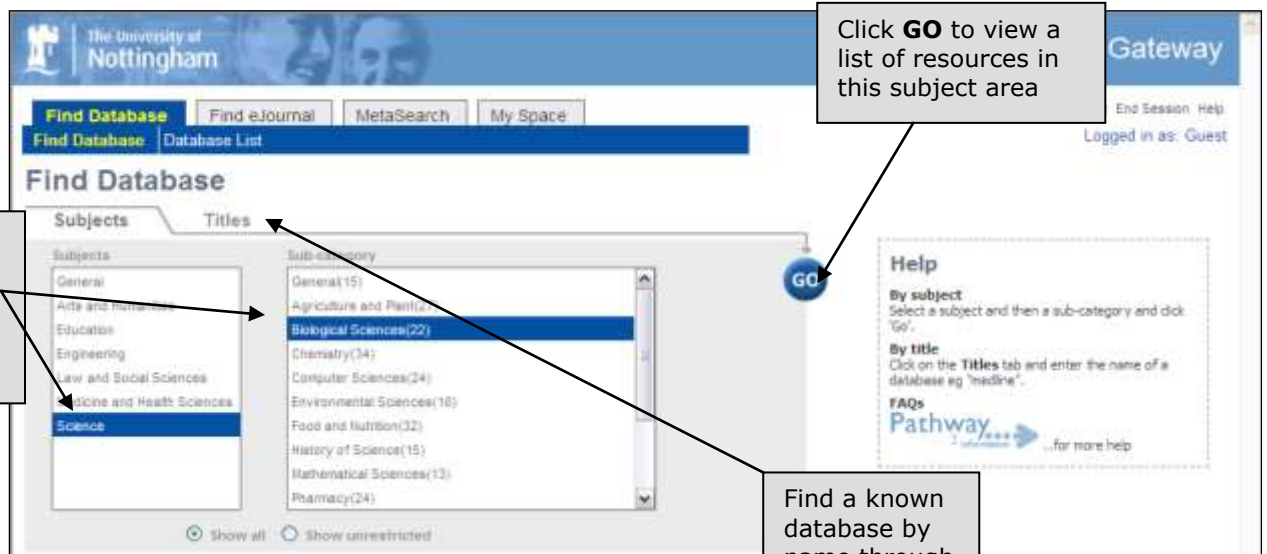

How do I find resources to search for information?

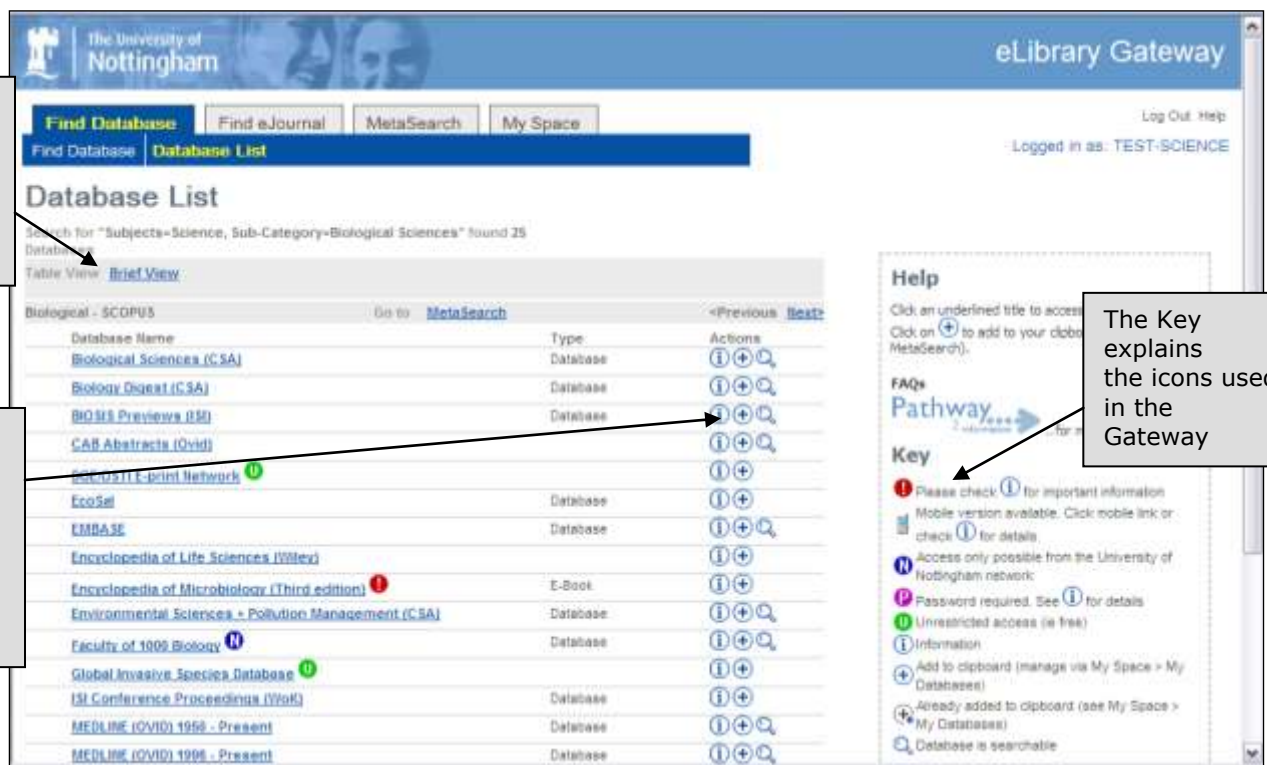
The Find Database screen enables you to identify information resources by subject using the appropriate category and subcategory. You can also search for a specific resource by selecting the **Title** tab and typing in the name of the resource e.g. Medline.



Select a subject category and sub-category

Click **GO** to view a list of resources in this subject area

Find a known database by name through the **Titles** tab



Select **Brief View** for a list with more details of resources

Click on the **+** icon to add a resource to your personal list

The Key explains the icons used in the Gateway

From the Database List you can click on the title of a resource to connect to it directly or mark resources to add to your personal list which can then be viewed under the **My Space** or **MetaSearch** tabs. Resources with the magnifying glass icon displayed in the **Actions** column can be cross searched through MetaSearch within the eLibrary Gateway. Resources without the magnifying glass icon must be searched individually by following the title links.

How do I search the resources for information on my subject?

The MetaSearch screen provides a search engine and cross-search facility which can be applied to all the resources flagged with the magnifying glass icon. If you have used the eLibrary Gateway before, you will see your selected resources displayed in the '**Clipboard**'. If not, you will see a list of general resources as shown below.

The 'hits' are individual journal articles or books etc and the references to these can be displayed by clicking on **View Results**.

Results from the first database display. Click **Results by Databases** to see results from other resources or combined results

Select **Brief View** or **Full View** or **Full View** to see references in more detail.

If you click on **Combined results** you can refine the search by Topics, Dates, Authors etc. displayed to the right of the results

Mark the references you wish to save with the basket icon. View them in **My Space**

Click the red **SFX** icon to see whether the reference is available online or in the library See below for more detail.

The SFX window shows availability of references. In this case the journal article is online and the **GO** button links to it. Note there may be information about access to the resource from off campus.

Alternatively follow the link to the library catalogue to check if the item is held in the library in print.

You can also follow up any related references which are displayed in the lower part of the SFX window.

How can I personalise the eLibrary Gateway?

Under the **My Space** tab you can save sets of references, selected from MetaSearch, on the 'eShelf'. Your personal choices of resources and journals can be set up under 'My databases' and 'My eJournals' and searches you wish to re-run are saved under the 'History' tab. You can also set preferred display settings under 'Preferences':

Tick boxes to select references and **Save** them from this screen.

How do I find electronic journals?

To find electronic journals select the **Find eJournal** tab to search by title:

A list of matching journal titles will be displayed with the SFX links, as above. It is also possible to search for journals by subject category or to locate a known article using the Citation Linker.
