Programme Leadership
 Work with other ambassadors as a team to deliver on UoN Sport objectives. Represent the student voice to develop a clear brand identity for Participation Sport and your relevant work programme. Support and manage student volunteers / leaders as required to fulfil the remits of your programme. Assist with raising awareness across campuses and all student groups on specific programme remits.
 Build partnerships and develop relationships with work programme specific networks.
 Marketing and Events Generate innovative ideas to market opportunities within your programme area, including recruitment of volunteers. Write regular content and celebrate successes via all available marketing outlets, including UoN Sport blogs and key social media channels. Support the planning and delivery of key events and activities. Assist with management of event volunteers. Work alongside the UoN Participation Sport Social Media ambassador and Sports Marketing Team to promote all activity online.

^{*}Work area specific duties, skills and experience:

Black Student Sport

- Knowledge and understanding of Black student behaviour, cultures and the barriers and facilitators to participation for Black students.
- Lived experience as a Black student and an understanding of the necessity for Black student representation across sport programmes and the wider university.
- Work with Black student groups, clubs, and networks to support with wider engagement from the Black student community.
- Overseeing and working with the wider Black Sport Collective team of student leaders and volunteers.



Disability Sport

- Promotion of the university's disability sport, activity and fitness offer.
- Provide disability sport and activity participation opportunities for students.
- An understanding of the barriers and facilitators to participation specifically for disabled people, people with long term health conditions and other under-represented groups.
- Lived experience of disability and/or long term health conditions and/or experience working with disabled people or people with long term health conditions.

<u> Iust Plav</u>

- Support and lead on areas within the Just Play 'come and try' programme including liaison with student volunteers, attending sessions, gathering feedback, attendance logging/analysis and collaboration with other programmes within participation sport.
- Event and Project management of specific campaigns such as Girls Night In, Just Play Festival, Martial Arts Week and Empower campaign.
- Specific targeting of non-engaged students in UoN Sport using innovative marketing and engagement tools.

Leadership Academy

- The Leadership Academy is the volunteering strand of UoN Sport, providing sports related volunteering opportunities for all students.
- Support with the recruitment and training of volunteers to meet the needs of all programmes and events across UoN Sport.
- Support with the coordination of community and school outreach activity including Discovery Days and Sport for Good.
- Support with the management of the Leadership Academy Qualification Fund and the online platform uonsportsleaders.com,
- Experience of working with young people in primary and secondary school settings. Experience and knowledge of volunteering, ideally within sport.

Men's Health Active

- The Men's Health Active campaign supports male students to use sport and physical activity to look after their mental health.
- Development and promotion of a MHA programme of events, including Talk Shops and sport and activity participation opportunities.
- Lived experience of mental health conditions and/or experience working with people with mental health problems.

Event

- Work as part of a small team of event specific ambassadors that support various UoN Sport programmes to provide on the day event assistance.
- Events and campaigns may include, but not limited to; Halls Night in, Girls Night in, Discovery Days, Engagement Days, Active Living events, Empower week, Open Days and more.
- This is a varied role which may include setting up of event spaces, welcoming and registering attendees, facilitating activities, managing volunteers and more.

Rugby Minds
