What to expect, where to go and how to make the most of your day

## What you need to know

### Do I need to register?

You will not need to formally register when you arrive at University Park Campus, but you will need to register on Jubilee and Sutton Bonington Campuses.

Please remember to bring your invitation letter and hand it in at any one of our information points, clearly marked on the campus maps by this icon  and you will receive a free tote bag.

### How do I connect to Wi-Fi?

Feel free to make use of our wireless internet access while you're here. You can connect your own laptop or mobile device free of charge. Search for UoN-guest wireless, open a web browser and enter an email address to connect. For help connecting, visit the IT services stand at the Support Services Fair (see page 36 for detail).

### How do I pick up information about courses?

All subjects will be represented in information hubs on University Park Campus for the purpose of the event, so you can pick up information for all subjects from all campuses in one location. See page 37 to find your relevant hub.

Please be aware that some subject activities require pre-booking or are ticketed on the day. Find your subject in the A-Z listing and check the booking requirement column.

### How do I find help on the day?

On the day, student and staff helpers in bright green t-shirts will be all over our campuses – you can't miss them! They're very happy to help you with any queries.

Visit the events office in B37, Portland Building (no. 15 on map) where you can find:

- lost property
- a place to leave your luggage
- first aid
- a sign language interpreter

If you need help getting around, there is an accessible minibus available to transport visitors around University Park Campus. Please call 07813 459 196 at any time between 8.30am and 5pm on the day if you require this service.

### Can we see culture on campus?

We have a unique public arts centre and museum on campus, Nottingham Lakeside Arts. To find out more about the eclectic programme of music, dance, theatre, visual arts and family events visit the stand at the Support Services Fair (see page 36). Nottingham is also home to England's first entirely student-run theatre. Drop in on the day for a tour of our stand-alone theatre (no. 12 on map).

**How big is the campus?**  
Our campuses are large and hilly in places – particularly University Park which covers 330 acres – so it’s best to wear suitable clothing and comfortable footwear as you could be doing a lot of walking.

**Are there cash facilities available?**  
If you forget to bring cash on the day to use in our catering outlets, don't worry, as all of our campuses have cash machine facilities.

On University Park Campus you will find a NatWest and Santander cash machine located in the Portland Building; on Jubilee Campus there is a cash machine inside The Exchange building next to the bookshop; and on Sutton Bonington Campus there is a cash machine in the Main Building near to The Barn and catering outlets. ### Travelling by train

#### University Park and Jubilee Campuses

- Book a train to Nottingham railway station.
- On arrival look out for staff and students in purple t-shirts who will direct you to free shuttle buses to the relevant campus.

#### Sutton Bonington Campus

- Book a train to Loughborough railway station.
- On arrival look out for staff and students in purple t-shirts who will direct you to free shuttle buses to the relevant campus.

### Travelling by bus

#### University Park and Jubilee Campuses

- Travel to Broadmarsh bus station.
- Take a short walk to Nottingham train station.
- On arrival look out for staff and students in purple t-shirts who will direct you to free shuttle buses to the relevant campus.

#### Sutton Bonington Campus

We recommend you travel by train and use the free shuttle bus service from Loughborough.

However if you wish to travel by bus, please travel to Broadmarsh bus station and follow instructions on how to get to University Park Campus. Once at University Park, take a free shuttle bus to Sutton Bonington Campus. Please see the timetable on page 41.

### Travelling by car

#### University Park and Jubilee Campuses

Parking for University Park and Jubilee Campuses is available for free at University Park Campus only. A free shuttle bus will run between the two campuses all day.

#### From the M1

Leave the M1 at junction 25 to join the A52, signposted to Nottingham. Follow the A52 to Nottingham for approximately four miles and then follow the directions below to the West or North Entrance, depending on your subject of interest.

There are other exits to Nottingham from the M1. However, we recommend you follow the above which is the most direct route to the University from both the M1 north and the M1 south.

#### West Entrance – for visitors interested in arts, law and social science subjects

At the Toby Carvery roundabout, turn right on to the A6464, Woodside Road. Turn left at the next roundabout to enter the University's West Entrance.

#### North Entrance – for visitors interested in science, engineering, medicine and health science subjects

At the Toby Carvery roundabout, take the second exit continuing on the A52, Derby Road. At the Queen's Medical Centre roundabout, take the fourth exit and then take the first left to enter the University's North Entrance.

### From the city centre


Those travelling from the city centre to University Park Campus should follow signs to the Queen's Medical Centre, and then follow the directions on the AA road signs for the University's North or West Entrances (see left).

#### Car parking

When you arrive on campus, security staff will direct you to available parking areas. Remember to take note of where you have parked so you can find your car at the end of the day!

Toilets are available in academic buildings and in halls of residence that are open on the day. Check the campus map at the back of the programme for detail of additional toilet facilities.

#### On arrival

Once parked, you do not need to formally register and can make your way straight to activities! Please remember to hand in your invitation letter to staff and student helpers at information points marked on the map by  to receive your free tote bag.

If you are heading to Jubilee Campus or Sutton Bonington Campus from University Park, you can use the free shuttle buses from the open day shuttle bus terminal on East Drive (see pages 40–43). There is also a free shuttle bus which runs on a loop around University Park Campus (see page 42). Please be aware that when you arrive at the Jubilee or Sutton Bonington Campuses you will need to register.

### Sutton Bonington Campus

If you are travelling by car you can make your way directly to Sutton Bonington Campus where free parking is available.

#### From the M1

Leave the M1 at junction 24, signposted Nottingham (South), East Midlands Airport and A6. Join the A6, Derby Road, towards Kegworth. Turn left into Side Ley, following signs to Sutton Bonington and the yellow AA road signs to The University of Nottingham Open Day Sutton Bonington Campus.

Follow the road over a canal and turn right into Station Road, signposted Sutton Bonington Campus. Turn right onto College Road. The West Entrance to the campus is on the left-hand side.

#### Car parking

When you arrive on campus, follow directions to open day car parking, highlighted yellow on the map and marked with a .



### Culture and sport

With over 100,000 students at the city's universities and colleges, Nottingham is a vibrant place with plenty to keep you busy. The compact city centre, only 10 minutes away from University Park and Jubilee Campuses by bus or bike, combines heritage and history with contemporary culture.

There is much to entertain you in Nottingham. The Theatre Royal and Royal Concert Hall showcase theatre, comedy, ballet and opera, while Nottingham Playhouse produces high-quality drama.

Film buffs can choose from a 14-screen cinema in the city centre Cornerhouse complex, two multiplexes or the independent Broadway cinema and media centre, which shows the best in independent, arthouse and foreign language films. The Savoy Cinema is a popular destination for students, located in the middle of the student area of Lenton.

Nottingham is also a major centre for music. Large venues such as the Royal Concert Hall and the Capital FM Arena, and well-established clubs including Rock City, attract big names from a wide range of musical genres. If you prefer your music alternative, there are venues dotted all over the city.

If you love sport the region has plenty to offer. With a long sporting heritage, Nottingham offers world-class sporting entertainment at venues like Trent Bridge (cricket), The City Ground (football), the National Ice Centre, Nottingham Racecourse, the National Water Sports Centre at Holme Pierrepont and the Nottingham Tennis Centre.

### Nightlife

Nottingham's nightlife is as legendary as its local hero, Robin Hood. From Britain's oldest inn to contemporary bars, club nights and student specials, Nottingham has something for everyone and food here is fantastic. From authentic tapas to chic sushi, fine dining to vegetarian fast-food, you could go to a different restaurant every day in the city and still have not visited them all.

### Shopping

Designer Sir Paul Smith sets the tone for this fashion-conscious city with his original store in Byard Lane. Nottingham has two large shopping centres, several major department stores, stylish shopping arcades such as Flying Horse Walk, and a host of independent boutiques and vintage shops.

### Relaxing

If you want to take a break from the pace of city life, the region offers striking landscapes in the beautiful Peak District National Park as well as historic hideaways including Newstead Abbey, Southwell Minster, Wollaton Hall and Robin Hood's Sherwood Forest.
