What is a degree apprenticeship?

Occupational standards and End-point assessments are designed by employers

Combines paid work with a programme of academic study – funded by the employer, no cost to the apprentice

Apprentices continue to earn throughout the programme including the time they spend learning off-the-job

Individual learning plans which take in to consideration things such as; prior learning, contracted hours and learning differences

Minimum 20% off-the-job (OTJ) to dedicate to developing themselves as a professional, enabling them to focus on advancing their skills and knowledge.

Blended/hybrid learning experience including face to face online and in person sessions (day release, block release, tutorials, vidcons)

Develop the necessary skills and hands on experience – applying the learning in the workplace

Gain a bachelors or masters level qualification

Integrated

- Advanced Clinical Practitioner (Health)
- Architect

Non-integrated

- Senior Leader

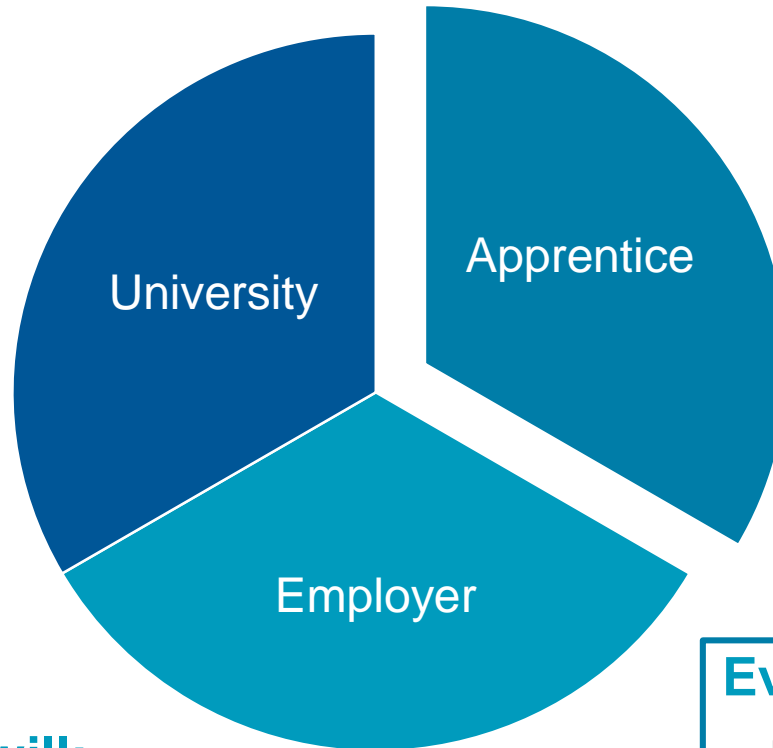
Roles and responsibilities

The university will:

- Provide a learning environment that allows the apprentice to learn safely.
- Lead on the tripartite reviews

The employer will:

- Provide a working environment that allows the apprentice to work and learn safely
- Provide the apprentice with the on the job knowledge, skills, and experience needed to complete the apprenticeship



The apprentice will:

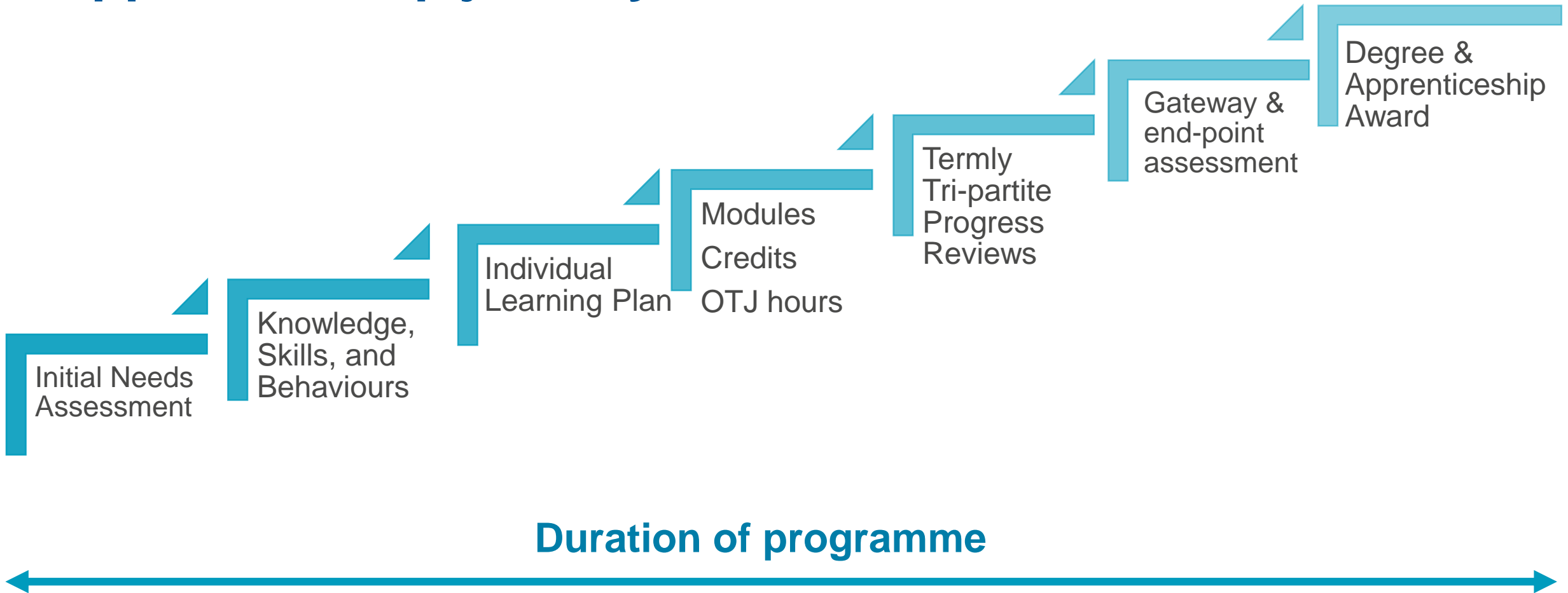
- Manage their own learning with support from employer and academic mentors
- Participate in course feedback and apprenticeship evaluation

Everybody's responsibilities:

- Meet targets and deadlines set out in the ILP
- Work with each other to meet 20% OTJ requirements for the apprentice
- Participate in tripartite reviews
- Inform all parties about changes in circumstances



Apprenticeship journey overview





Gateway & EPA

Gateway

- An assessment of the apprentice's readiness to undertake the end-point assessment (i.e. developed all of the necessary knowledge, skills, and behaviours and evidence is logged in Aptem)
- All three parties (apprentice, employer, university) need to agree that the apprentice is ready for the EPA.

End Point Assessment - Integrated

- The final module(s) will be the end point assessment
- There are specific EPA assessment elements dictated in the EPA plan
- Confers the final apprenticeship grade

End Point Assessment – Non-integrated

- Carried out by an external end-point assessment organisation
- There are specific EPA assessment elements dictated in the EPA plan
- Confers the final apprenticeship grade

External Examiner Duties

What is your job as an external examiner (where do you fit in)

Largely the same role as an EE for a non-apprenticeship programme.

Assessments will be verified in the usual manner, but you should be aware that elements may be mapped to the apprenticeship standard KSBs in addition to degree learning outcomes.

The curriculum for apprenticeship programmes may be designed in such a way that the KSBs and learning outcomes are the same.



Moderating modules

Grading should be moderated in the usual manner for degree provision.

When assessments are mapped to the KSBs, or apprentices are asked to incorporate or reflect upon their development against the KSBs, tutor feedback may mention this. As EE you may wish to make specific comment about the quality of this feedback.





Moderating EPA modules for integrated programmes

EPAs are assessed by Independent assessors and, in integrated programmes, account for credits of the degree award.

There is a specific assessment plan defined in the apprenticeship standard EPA plan and so assessments may consist of various elements and grading criteria may be different to those used in other parts of the programme.

The internal moderation process of EPA module assessments is rigorous and as EE you will be asked to moderate and verify the outcomes for the purposes of the degree.

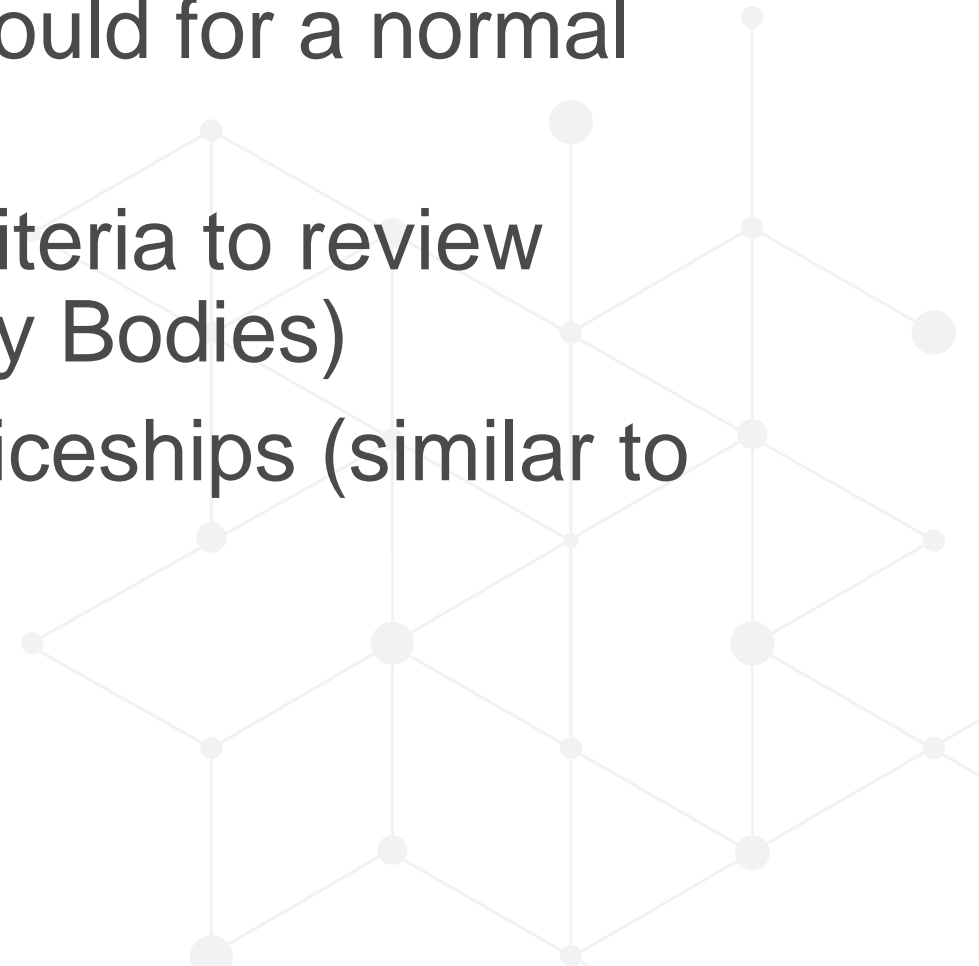
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How to complete your annual external examiner report

- Some of you may also have PSRB Criteria to review (Professional Statutory and Regulatory Bodies)
- There is a specific section on Apprenticeships (similar to 2021)

Mixed cohorts look at samples (mix of both), any differences?

Apprenticeship is the development of KSBs (and then finally the EPA)

Mapping of the KSBs outlines what progress is made against the apprenticeship standard (in each module and overall), discuss with the programme team.

If you are meeting apprentices ask them too

Ofsted

- Since April 2021 the quality of 'degree-level' apprenticeship programmes in the UK (up to the point the learner starts the EPA) are regulated by Ofsted.
- Quality Assurance Agency (QAA) quality assure EPAs from 2022.
- Unlikely Ofsted will engage with external examiners but your annual report could be reviewed.
- Safeguarding and Prevent training will be offered if you are interested in completing this. It is only mandatory if you plan to speak to apprentices unaccompanied. Accessed from our online central course provision (using your UoN username).
