

Example CV – international student

If applying for roles in the UK, use UK spelling, for example 'Optimisation' not 'Optimization'.

Read our advice on how to talk about non-UK qualifications on your CV.

You don't need to use the pronoun 'I' when writing about your experience in a CV (although some people like to include this).

When writing about current experience, you can use verbs in the gerund form, or in the present, for example, 'assisting' or 'assist'.

Write about completed work experience using the past simple tense.

Use a range of active verbs when talking about your experience. <u>See the active</u> verbs list for ideas

Do not include any unnecessary personal details.

Careers and Employability Service

Using expanded noun phrases in a profile section can help add detail without making the word count too long.

Avoid using cliché or overly effusive language, for example, 'Looking to apply this skillset in a graduate role in consultancy' not 'I have been dreaming of a consultancy job for as long as I can remember'.

Be direct and confident in your statements. For example, use "I have developed..." instead of "I tried to develop..." or "I aimed to develop...".

It isn't necessary to include all of your past experience, only those that are relevant to the role. For advice on what to include, <u>book a CV review</u> appointment with us.

Around three or four bullet points for each role is usually sufficient.





Can a filler adverb, like 'efficiently' or 'successfully' be quantified? Adding numbers or metrics (where possible) increases impact. Bullet point can be re-written to say:
Managed up to 300 students daily, resolving 90% of issues on first contact.

Use concise and formal language. Avoid phrasal verbs where you can use a single verb, for example,. 'Kept accurate records of card collections' not 'Wrote down the names of everyone who came up to me to get their card.'

You can include additional qualifications, awards, and training in your CV, but make sure you list the organisation that provided the qualification or award (for example, LinkedIn Learning, Cambridge English, University of Nottingham).
