At this stage there is no need for you to include your GCSEs or A levels on your CV. Do include both degrees and the 'University Of Nottingham' in this section. You can also include your research project title and some brief details, if relevant.

You do not need to include all of your EMS placements. Choose the most recent and relevant to the role you are applying for, these are likely to be your clinical placements not your animal husbandry as you get nearer to graduation. Employers know you have done the minimum placements in all specialisms in order to graduate.
