This access map has been produced in consultation with current students to show the best routes around campus for wheelchair users and people with mobility difficulties. Please find below some useful information about the University and where to eat, drink and shop as you find your way around University Park. We hope you enjoy your visit.

## Friends of University Park

Friends of University Park is a voluntary group that aims to encourage both members of the University and the wider community to make full use of University Park. Throughout the spring, summer & autumn months, the group organises a series of events, walks and talks centred on various aspects of the park, including its gardens, plants, heritage and wildlife. Most events are accessible for people with disabilities and mobility issues.

## Using the map

**Preferred routes**  
Routes on campus can be very steep for extended distances, and may not be negotiable by manual wheelchair users. The 'preferred routes' shown are the best option for wheelchair users, with indication of gradient and direction of incline.

**Gradients**  
The chevrons » on the preferred routes point uphill.

No chevrons indicates the route is level or has a very gentle gradient.

More chevrons indicates a steeper route.

**Footpaths**  
Many of the footpaths on campus are omitted from the Access Map, for clarity.

## Further access maps

## Accessible toilets

Most buildings have one or more wheelchair accessible toilets. Their locations are shown on the building plans available at the link above, and on plans fixed at building entrances.

## Student Services Centre

The Student Services Centre in Portland Building (15) provides a highly visible, accessible centre for all students. Students can carry out a broad range of essential tasks in one convenient location. They can speak with experienced advisers, who have a wide knowledge of the University and gain access to specialist support services.

In addition, Disability Liaison Officers are appointed in each School to provide a point of reference, advice and guidance and for all students and members of staff about disability issues and support.

## Getting here

**Travelling by Car**  
**University Park Campus – from the M1 North**  
Take the M1 southwards. Leave the M1 motorway at Junction 25 to join the A52 to Nottingham. After a few miles you will arrive at Bardills roundabout, take the second exit (signposted Nottingham) and then at Bramcote roundabout continue along the A52 to follow the signs to Nottingham. At the Priory Hotel roundabout take the third exit onto A6464 Woodside Road. Turn left at the next roundabout into the University's West Entrance.

**University Park Campus – from the M1 South**  
Take the M1 northwards. Leave the M1 motorway at Junction 25 to join the A52 to Nottingham. After a few miles you will arrive at Bardills roundabout, take the second exit (signposted Nottingham) and then at Bramcote roundabout continue along the A52 to follow the signs to Nottingham. At the Priory Hotel roundabout take the third exit onto A6464 Woodside Road. Turn left at the next roundabout into the University's West Entrance.

## Travel information

**Public bus services**

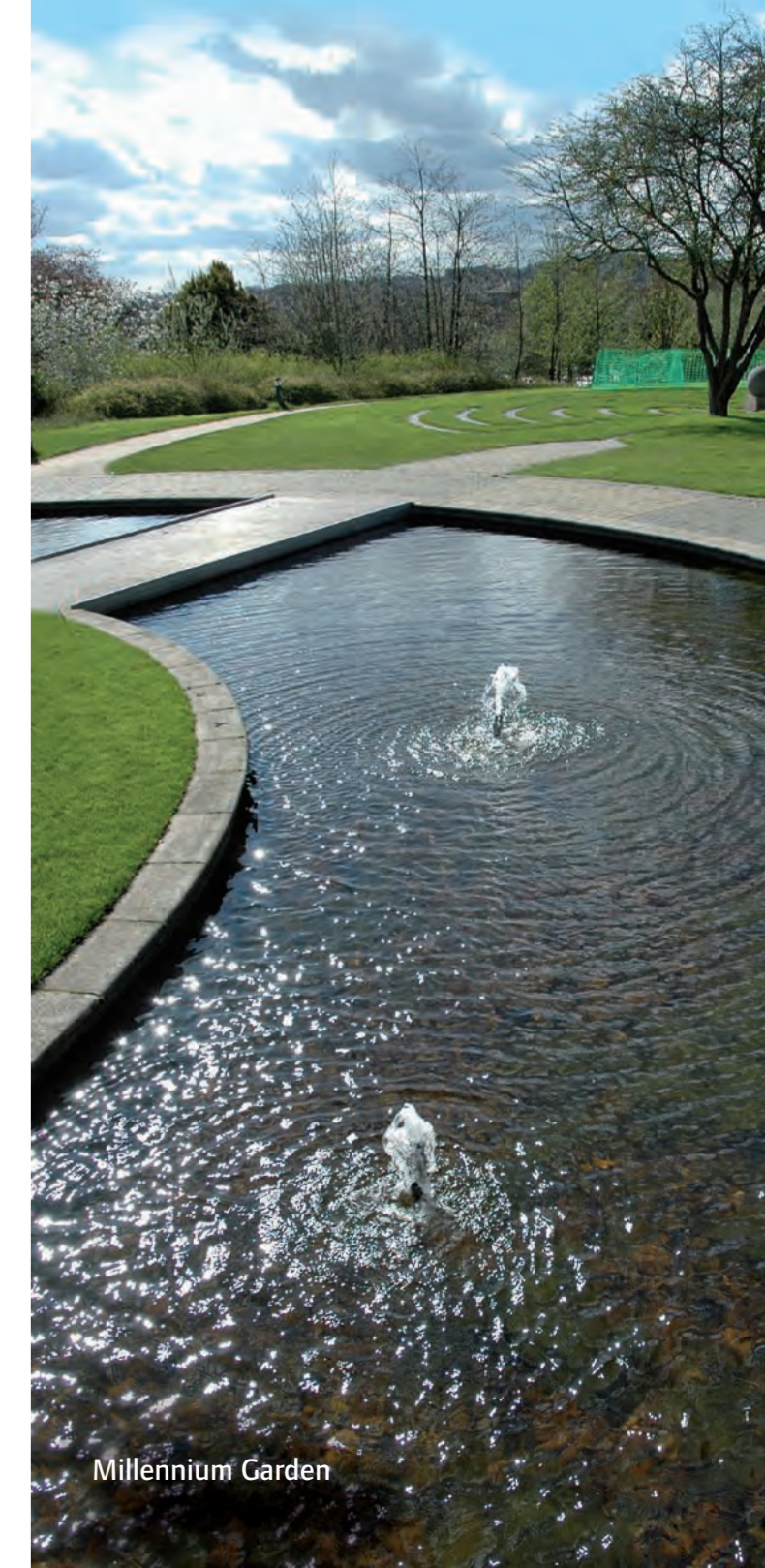

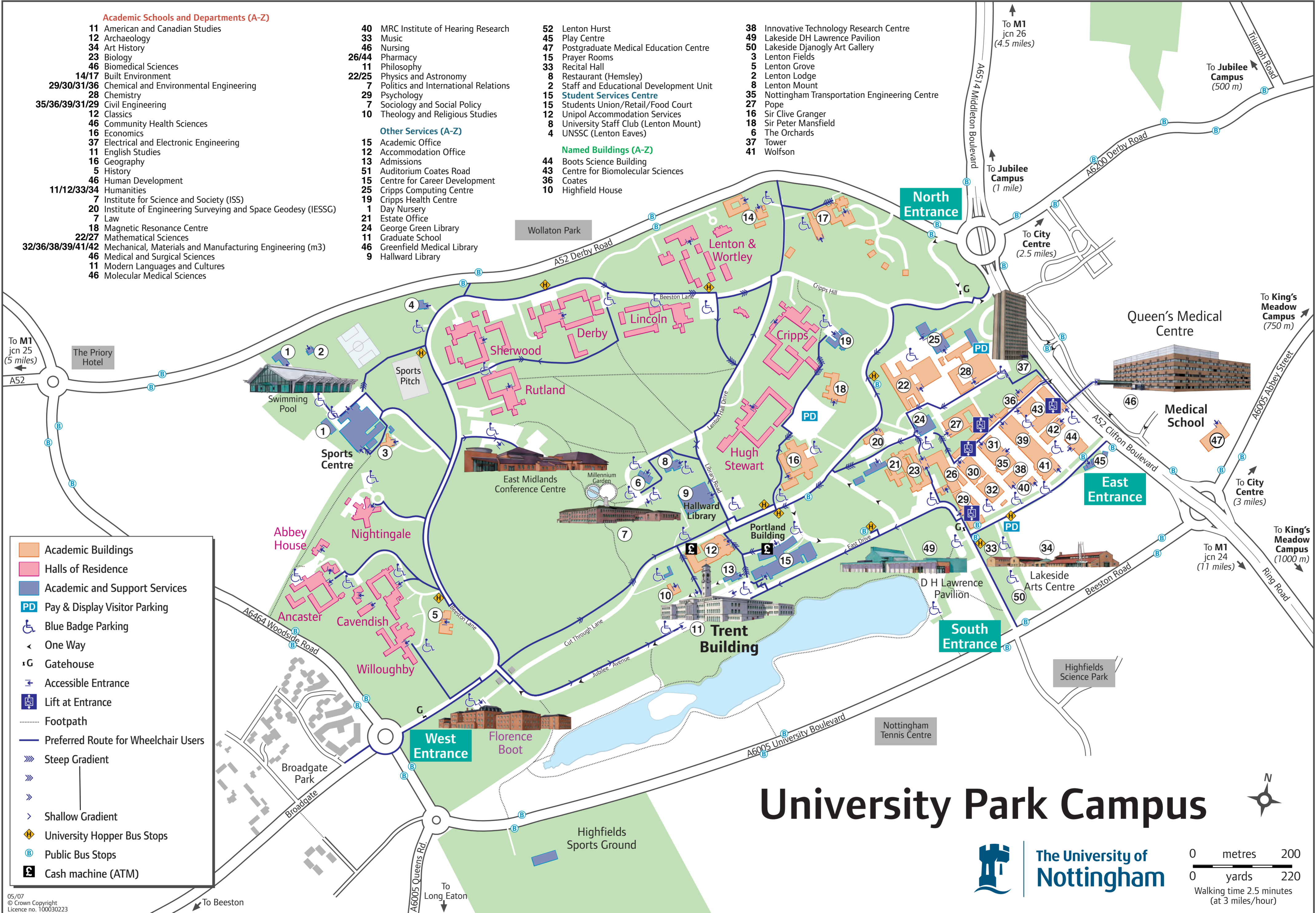
