Research topic:

Evidence-based veterinary medicine; Determination of survival rates of cats with lymphoma

Summary of research:

Despite a decrease in the incidence of retroviral-related feline lymphoma, there has been an increase in the incidence of feline lymphoma.

Anne will be following up cats in which a diagnosis of lymphoma has been made by cytology and histopathology and will determine how long these cats survive after chemotherapy is instituted.

As part of her project, she will also be comparing survival rates based on the signalment, anatomical location of the disease and subtypes of lymphoma these cats present with.

This work will help provide an evidence-base to assist clinicians in the management of Feline lymphoma.
