Time commitment

You must be available to respond regularly to prospective student questions through the Unibuddy platform. Often, this will be through the Unibuddy app on your personal smartphone.

The frequency of hours is between 0 to 2 hours per week, depending on the number of questions that you receive. Generally, very few ambassadors spend more than 1 hour on Unibuddy. This role will include some work outside of university term-time.

Professional conduct

You will be expected to represent the University of Nottingham whilst working within this role. It will be essential for you to comply with university policies related to CMA, data protection, and safeguarding. To enable this, you will be required to read a short training document before you begin the role.
