

What is the mentor scheme?

- Run by current Computer Science students
- Mentors are 2nd years and senior mentors are 3rd or 4th years
- Mentors will help you settle in and get use to University life in your 1st year.
- You have been allocated a mentor and working group - you can interact with all mentors and groups though.

What does it involve?

To start...

- Mentors are around to help you transition to University life, they can offer you informal direct support or advise you where to go to find the information you need.

Ongoing...

- There are six 50 min timetabled sessions with the mentors throughout the year.
- Monthly cake and fruit drops to give you chance to meet up with all mentors (and eat free cake!)
- All sessions are on your online timetable and start on 7th October.
