- 'Legal' doesn't mean safe. It's unlikely that its been tested!
- It could be packed with harmful substances!





'Legal Highs'


Under current legislation it is illegal to supply or advertise for 'human consumption' so sellers refer to 'legal highs' as research chemicals, plant food, bath crystals or pond cleaner.

They are not intended for human use so you really don't know what your getting!

'Legal highs' have all kinds of names, including brand names and chemical names.



Risks of 'legal highs'

Can include

- reduced inhibitions
- drowsiness
- excited or paranoid states
- coma, seizures, and death.

These risks are increased if used with alcohol or other drugs.



'Legal highs' and the law

 'Legal highs' may look similar to illegal drugs. If the police find a 'legal high' in your possession they are entitled to confiscate it for testing and may detain you for questioning, or even arrest you.

 'Legal highs' may contain one or more substances that are actually illegal to possess.

The Future of 'Legal Highs'

The Home Office will introduce oneyear temporary bans on new 'legal highs' as a way of taking them off the market while the health issues can be considered by an independent group of experts, the Advisory Council on the Misuse of Drugs (ACMD).



Just because its legal does not mean it is without risk!

- Mixing more than one substance (including alcohol) can be unpredictable and dangerous.
- Learn first aid so you will know what to do if an emergency arises. If in any doubt call an ambulance.
- If you take drugs, tell friends what you have taken in case of any difficulties.
