Did you know that...

- **▼The place-name Lenton** can be found in the Domesday Book of 1086.
- **VLenton takes it name** from the River Leen.
- **▼Lenton Priory** was founded in 1109 by Cluniac monks and existed until its dissolution by Henry VIII in 1538.
- **▼Lenton Lodge** was built in the 1820s and marked one of the entrances to the Wollaton Hall estate.
- ▼The Three Wheatsheaves pub once had a 'penfold' for stray farm animals.
- **▼Lenton Recreation Ground** opened in 1888 and is Nottingham's oldest recreation ground.
