## Collections of large items, bulky waste and appliances

To arrange a collection call 0115 915 2000, email [waste.management@nottinghamcity.gov.uk](mailto:waste.management@nottinghamcity.gov.uk)

**Nottingham City Council collects most furniture, electronic goods and garden waste free of charge, up to a limit of six items.**

Tumble dryers, washing machines and fridges/freezers are subject to a £12 collection charge (unless on approved benefit) and limited to three per year.

When you arrange a collection you will be asked to make sure the items are presented properly – please make sure:

- Small articles are bagged-up, otherwise they may get left behind.
- Any gates are left unlocked and our collection crew has reasonable access to your rubbish.
- Sofas, beds and carpets are covered.
- Branches and wood are tied and there are no sharp items (i.e. nails) remaining.
- Glass items are taped (including TV screens).
- The items you would like collected are clearly separated from any other items on your property.

We cannot take the following items

soil / tree trunks / asbestos / coal bunkers / concrete garages / fire surrounds / gas cylinders / oil cans / full paint cans / car parts including batteries / radiators / hazardous waste / fixtures and fittings / bathrooms and kitchens / building materials such as brick, plaster, rubble and stone

Simple as that!



## Grime crime: graffiti

Graffiti is an act of vandalism that costs thousands of pounds to remove or cover every year.

Anyone caught could be fined or prosecuted.

## Grime crime: waste on land

Leaving piles of waste in your garden, like unwanted furniture or carpets, can lead to substantial fines.

## Grime crime: fly tipping

Dumping waste is dangerous and destroys the local quality of life. You can use City Council bulky waste collection services to remove waste for you.

We will investigate fly tips and prosecute those responsible.

## Grime crime: littering

Littering is illegal and will lead to a fine or ultimately prosecution.

## Grime crime: bins on streets

Bins left on the street make a neighbourhood look a mess and are dangerous as they obstruct the highway.

Put your bin out no earlier than 8 hours before your collection day and bring them in from the pavement within 8 hours after your collection day.

Leaving bins on streets after collections will lead to a Fixed Penalty Notice of £100.
