Introduction

The Pack for Good campaign

Launched in 2011, since then we have grown to service over 100 universities, 15 councils, over 300 local private student accommodation providers and have successfully rolled out eleven national partnerships across the UK.

The campaign aims to reduce complexity whilst actively contributing to waste diversion, carbon reduction targets and ESG targets including charitable giving within your communities.

Every University that partners with us on our 'Pack for Good' campaign enables our shops and stores to receive a much needed regular supply of donations throughout the year.

The BHF has over 700 shops and stores across England, Wales, Scotland, and Northern Ireland including 510 high-street shops and over 180 home stores, which this year will sell around 25 million donated items.

The BHF eBay shop sells over 436,800 high value and unusual items each year, to raise funds for heart and circulatory diseases.

In a year, the BHF saves over 57,000 tonnes of goods from going to waste, including 103,000 sofas and 13,000 of preloved clothes.

Through the reuse and recycling of donated items this helps prevent 130,000 tonnes of CO2 emissions being released into the atmosphere.







This year we have collected over £23,000 of furniture from University Partners.

We have the ability to run large scale furniture removals e.g. accommodation refurbishments to supporting with working white goods and re-sellable mattresses.



CPR Training

Training your staff and students in lifesaving skills, such as CPR, defibrillator awareness and the recovery position, will help create a nation of life savers. Cardiac arrest can happen anywhere and to anyone so make sure your colleagues and students are prepared.

Pack for Good partners are are already helping to train first aiders in CPR and defibrillator awareness whilst also equipping an additional 150 members of staff and students in this life saving skill.

Sustainability

Partnering with us in our Pack for Good campaign enables our shops to receive a regular supply of donations during the summer period, a time typically, when donations can be lower than in other seasons.

By joining our Pack for Good campaign you're helping to save items from disposal, preventing unnecessary waste and carbon emissions being released into the atmosphere whilst also helping to fund research in heart disease, stroke, vascular dementia and diabetes.



Creating Healthier

Reducing Waste & Circular Economy

All BHF standard shops have recycling services for textiles, books and most for homewares

In 2020/21 we re-used/recycled 52,000 trees worth of books through our shops (5.5m)

4480 pairs of jeans we resold, helping save enough water to fill 28 Olympic swimming pools

Through re-use and recycling through our stores we have saved over 57,000 tonnes going to waste in 21/22, enabling 130,000 tonnes of avoided greenhouse gas emissions.







How does the BHF spend donations?






£2 can help researchers we fund visualise faulty heart cells under the microscope, allowing them to understand more about lifethreatening conditions like heart failure.



£6 can help to buy test tubes that researchers we fund use to aid their research into inherited heart conditions.



£18 could support one of our early career scientists to conduct one hour of research.

We currently fund around 400 early career scientists conducting post-doctoral research right across the UK. Their projects seek to understand how to diagnose, prevent, treat and cure heart and circulatory diseases.

(BHF supported 361 postdoc researchers and 31 clinical fellows on 31/03/22)

£85-100 is how much it costs to support one of our PhD students for just one day.

Schemes at top UK universities turn promising scientists into potential future leaders through three or four years of intensive scientific training.

We currently fund around 350 PhD students.

(BHF supported 358 PhD students on 01/04/22, assuming 4 students per 4 year grant)





University Funding

From Edinburgh to Cardiff, Belfast to London, we are supporting research projects but also strategic investments including the Centres of Research Excellence, Centres of Regenerative Medicine, the BHF Data Science Centre and Accelerator Awards. Through our commitment to beating heartbreak from all heart and circulatory diseases and their risk factors, we currently support over £410m of life saving research across 47 institutions in the UK to better understand, prevent, and treat heart and circulatory diseases.

Helen Doyle (24) thought her running dreams might be over when she was diagnosed with a heart problem. See how she's gone from surgery to the London Marathon, in pictures and Helen's own words.



"When I was told I had a heart problem, I felt like my whole life had been tipped upside down. Everything just stopped."



"There's a buzz you get when you race. It makes you feel really positive, especially when you're running with other people. Having people cheer you on is amazing."



"After surgery, you're completely dependent at first. You have to learn how to walk and talk again."



"I'm spending more time doing things I love now, because I feel like life's very short and my story could have ended up being very different. I feel lucky that I'm still here and I'm healthy."



"It's just readjusting your mindset. My heart has been fixed and the reason it's been fixed is so I can live my life."



"Even though it has been the most painful, awful experience in some ways, it's absolutely amazing in others. It's changed my life and put everything into perspective."

London Marathon Support


