Postgraduate Engineering students - English language preparation

The Centre for English Language Education (CELE) runs 10 week and five week English language and study skills courses for international students whose language skills are close to the level required for their chosen programme of study. The courses take place over the summer, and give students vital skills that will assist them in their academic studies as well as life outside University.

Designed together with the Faculty of Engineering, the courses are therefore excellent preparation for your MSc programme. Successful students progress to the Faculty of Engineering with no need to take an IELTS test. 98% of students were successful on the presessional course in 2014

If you are close to the English language level you need to study an MSc in The University of Nottingham's Faculty of Engineering, you can apply for a joint offer. This means that:

- you only need one TIER 4 visa and CAS
- you take a 10 or five week English Language and Academic Skills preparation course, and then go on to your MSc
- you have a guaranteed place on your MSc course
- your progression to the MSc is automatic, provided you attend and complete all the coursework
