Local Information

The Marco Fanno Department of Economics and Management is one of the most highly-ranked economics departments in Italy. It is part of the University of Padua, the World's third oldest University (founded 1222) and one of the leading centres of the Scientific Revolution of the 17th century.

The city of Padua is about 40 km south-west of Venice. It is easily reachable from Venice and Treviso airport. Founded in Roman times, it boasts a picturesque and lively medieval city centre, a stunning 13th century City Hall, and the World's first Botanical Garden (a UNESCO World Heritage site). Once known as the "painted city" for its unparalleled medieval frescoes (among which Giotto's masterpiece, the Cappella degli Scrovegni), Padua is Italy's official candidate for inclusion in the 2020 UNESCO World Heritage list.
