The objective of the **RAMHHE** conference is to promote an anti-stigma and inclusive day, where people can express their views and perceptions of mental health through collective dialogue.

The aims of the **RAMHHE** conference are to provide a social learning space that will encourage collaborative discussions and to inform universities of the need to involve the student voice in the development of campaigns and awareness initiatives for mental health.

We will engage in discussions on five key issues:

- 1. Why do higher education students experience mental health?
- 2. How can we create an awareness of mental health among higher education students?
- 3. What strategies can we put in place to better support mental health in higher education?
- 4. How can we promote peer to peer support for mental health among higher education students?
- 5. How can we provide a space for higher education students to express their views and perceptions of mental health?

Information from the conference will provide an interdisciplinary insight into how to raise awareness of mental health in higher education.

Tables and poster boards will be provided for participating services to display their information materials and engage with students and other attendees.
