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Transcript – Preparing for the ward round.

Arranging to meet the Pharmacist

Ward Manager:

Emma I just wanted to check how you are doing?

Emma:

I'm feeling really tired and I'm drugged up all the time. I just don't feel right on these meds.

Ward Manager:

Ok, well I could get the pharmacy to come along and speak with you; there are tablets you can take for side effects as well as other types of medication. I know it's really difficult at first, but you're doing really well. If you just stick with it in time, the side effects will pass.

Emma speaks with the Pharmacist

Ward Manager:

Anything particular, that you have got on your mind?	

Silence.....

PSW:

maybe your leave?

Emma:

I spoke to Jo the pharmacist about my medication, so I'd like to talk about that.

PSW:

Oh ok, is there anything in particular about the medication?

Emma:

Well the pharmacist said I could be on a different medication but that she would need to speak to the doctor. I don't know if she's done that?

PSW:

Oh, well. I'll check up on that and we will know then for the ward round. If that is happened already. Is there anything else that you wanted to raise?

Emma:

I want some leave to go home.

MDT Options for medication:

Ward Manager:

OK team, so Emma has put down on the agenda for her ward round that she wants to discuss medication. She has had a chat with the Pharmacist and with Doctor about changing her medication, so what we need to do is that we need to make sure that we support her to make an informed decision during the ward round

<u>Pharmacist speaking with the doctor on the phone:</u>

Pharmacist: Hi Doctor, when I met with Emma Johnstone, your patient on the ward yesterday, she was having some issues with her current medication. She said it's making her feel sedated and was interested in alternatives?

Pause whilst doctor speaks (this dialogue is not heard).

Pharmacist: OK, well if you offer those alternatives in the Ward round that will be fine.
