

Dr BERTRAND G.RAMCHARAN (Guyana)

Dr Bertrand G. Ramcharan, LL.M., Ph.D (LSE), Barrister-at-Law of Lincoln's Inn, is currently Director of the Guyana Institute of Public Policy. He was UN High Commissioner for Human Rights *ad interim* in 2003-2004 with the rank of UN Under-Secretary-General, and Deputy High Commissioner from 1998-2003. He was Professor and First Swiss Chair of International Human Rights Law at the Graduate Institute of International Studies, Geneva from 2006-2008 and has been Chancellor of the University of Guyana. He has been UN Fellow at Harvard University's Kennedy School of Government (2004-2005) and, before that, Fellow of the LSE. He was a member of the UN Panel of Eminent Persons on Human Rights in Darfur (2007), Special Adviser to the UN Secretary-General on the peace process in Georgia (2008), and member of the ILO Commission of Inquiry into trade union and human rights in Zimbabwe (2009-2010). He is the author or editor of thirty books, the latest of which are: Contemporary Human Rights Ideas, Routledge, 2008, Preventive Diplomacy at the UN, Indiana University Press, 2008; and Preventive Human Rights Strategies, Routledge, 2010. He has just completed a book on the UN Human Rights Council, to be published by Routledge.
