Damages: 40s. He produces suit. John comes and defends the force and says he is not guilty. Inq.

On Mon after the feast of St Wilfrid 27 Edward III (13 Oct 1353) on the Pavement (*le Pavement*), Robert and Isabella made an assault on John, wounded, beat and bloodied him against the king's peace. Damages: 40s. He produces suit. Robert and Isabella come and defend the force and say they are not guilty. Inq. The parties agreed. John [in mercy].

44 PLEA M 3d. • Robert de Bughton <offered> and Isabella his wife pls offered themselves v John of Wirral def <put>. Plea: trespass and bloodshed. On Mon after the feast of St Wilfrid 27 Edward III (13 Oct 1353) in a place called the Pavement (*le Pavement*), John of Wirral made an assault on Isabella, Robert's wife, beat, wounded, maltreated and bloodied her against the king's peace. Damages: 20s. They produce suit. John comes and defends the force and says he is not guilty. Inq. The parties agreed. John [in mercy].

On Wed after the feast of All Saints 25 Edward III (2 Nov 1351) William, Thomas and John entered John son of John's house with force and arms, took and carried off a furnace (*furnasium*) worth 20s. and a pair of quernstones (*quernestoues*) and unjustly detain them against the king's peace. Damages: 100s. He produces suit. William, Thomas and John come and defend the force and say they are not guilty. Inq.

46 PLEA IN RESPITE INQ M 2d. William Baroude pl <np> offered himself v John Gose def. Plea: detinue of a tapet. On Tues before [the feast] of the assumption BVM 26 Edward III (14 Aug 1352) William pledged (*invadiavit*) a tapet worth ½m to John for 20d. without any other condition (*sine aliqua alia condicione*) made between them; William came and sought the pledge (*vadium*) on suitable days and opportune places (*diebus et locis oportunis*) [and] to pay 20d. to John Gose; John Gose refused and refuses to hand over the pledge to William and unjustly detains it against the king's peace. Damages: 10s. He produces suit. John Gose comes and defends the force and says he is not [guilty].¹² Inq.

After William had come to those parts and had completed his day's journey (*ad partes istos pervenerit et dietam suam compleverit*) he sought the surcoat according to the agreement made between them; John refused and still refuses to hand over the surcoat against the king's peace. Damages: 10s. He produces suit. John comes and defends the force and says he made no covenant with William. Inq.

48 PLEA JUDGEMENT • Ralph Torcard <np> and Matilda his wife executrix of the will of John of Widmerpool sometime her husband, pls offered themselves v John of Tumby, John Scot and Avicia, John Scot's wife, executors of John of Tumby's will. John, John and Avicia have not paid and unjustly detain 47s. to Ralph and Matilda his wife which they owe them. John of Tumby, of whom John, John and Avicia are executors, was bound in his lifetime to John of Widmerpool, Matilda's testator (*testator*), for 47s. to be paid to John of Widmerpool on Sun after the feast of St Martin 24 Edward III (14 Nov 1350). Because John of Tumby and John of Widmerpool were dead on the day of payment, Matilda was alone (*dum fuit sola*) on the day of payment. She sought the 47s. debt from John, John and Avicia, who, on the said day agreed to pay Matilda the debt within 15 days following after the said day; after 15 fully complete days Matilda ... sought the debt from John, John and Avicia, who paid nothing of the debt to her. Afterwards, Ralph and Matilda after their marriage (*post matrimonium ineter eos complet*), sought the debt from John, John and Avicia, who were unwilling to pay them. Damages: 40s. They produce suit. John, John and Avicia came (*venerunt*) in court and defended the force and sought if they they should have to vouch for (*ad testificandum*) the debt. Ralph and Matilda held out to verify their suit by inq and for the certification of the debt [by] the mayor; they put the will of Matilda's testator, the will of John of Widmerpool, in court (*pretenderunt verificare querelam suam per inquisitionem et ad maiorem certificationem debiti predicti posuerunt testamentum testatoris predictae Matilde in cur' viz' testamentum Johannis de Wydmerpole*). John, John, and Avicia sought judgement that the debt is by (*per*) the executors v the executors and they should not place before any deed or particularity in court than the testament of the said John of Widmerpool sought for the said debt if they should be held to reply to them or not (*et non pretenderit aliquod factum [?] neque spalitatem in cur' quam testamentum predicti Johannis de Wydmepole ad predictum debitum petendum si teneantur eis respondere vel non*). Judgement.
