As to 12d., he acknowledges himself bound for 8d. which he has shown (*ostendit*) he is ready (*fore*) to pay. As to the rest, he says he owes him nothing. [Inq.] William, by his attorney, comes and says he detains as above; he was not ready to pay. Inq.

From Michaelmas 32 Edward III (29 Sept 1358) William continuously broke and burnt (*fregit et combustus fuit*) John's hedges and hays (*cepes et hayas*) and entered his close (*clausum*) against the peace. Damages: 20s. William comes and defends the force and says he is not guilty. Inq.

**62** M 3d. • John of Denby pl offered himself v William Prest def <not guilty ...>. Plea: trespass. On Wed before the feast of St Leonard 33 Edward III (30 Oct 1359) William with his dogs (*canibus*) tracked and crushed (*vestigavit et conculcavit*) John's sow (*suem*) worth ½m against the peace. Damages: 10s. He produces suit. William comes and defends the force and says he is not guilty. Inq.

**63** PLEA • William Priour pl offered himself v John Swynard and Agnes his wife defs. Plea: trespass. Do [not] come. Dis.

On Thurs after the feast of the invention HC 30 Edward III (5 May 1356) William of Soothill handed over a leaden vessel (*plumbum*) and a vat (*cuvam*) worth 10s.<sup>17</sup> to William Priour to be returned whenever he asked; he detained and still detains the leaden vessel and vat. Damages: 20s. He produces suit. William Priour comes and defends the force and says he detains nothing. Inq.

**66** M 3d. • John Dovy pl offered himself v William of Coton def <not guilty>. Plea: trespass and bloodshed. On Mon before the feast of St Leonard 33 Edward III (4 Nov 1359) William made an assault on John with force and arms, wounded, beat, maltreated and bloodied him against the peace. Damages: 100s. He produces suit. William comes and defends the force and says he is not guilty. Inq.

**67** M 2d. • Richard of Linby pl offered himself v John Balideyn def <put>. Plea: trespass. First default. Does not come. Dis.

**68** • Alice the garlicseller pl <essoin> offered herself v William of Sutton def. Plea: trespass. On Mon before the feast of the invention HC 33 Edward III (29 Apr 1359) at Melton William arrested (*arestare fecit*) Alice's goods and chattels: a horse, and Alice was condemned by way of extortion (*condempnat' erat per viam extorsionis*) by William for 10s. when William was able to have had sufficient remedy (*sufficiens remedium*) before the mayor and his bailiffs. Damages: ½m. He produces suit. Richard comes and defends the force and says he broke no covenant. Inq.
