Henry took and abducted a haircloth (*heyre*) worth 20s.6d. on Mon before the feast of St Matthew (19 Sept 1362) against the peace. Damages: 100s. Henry comes and defends and says he is not guilty. Inq.

Robert assigned his terms (*terminos suos*) to Alice his wife with the goods and chattels. After the assignment (*assignacionem*) Alice remained in the house for a whole year with William's assent; before the end of the term of 5 years by a whole year he ejected (*ejecit*) John and Alice from the house so that he broke the covenant made [between them].
