**1** M NOTHING Richard Barbour of Nottingham in his own person complains of Henry Clerk of Brailston. Plea: debt. Henry for a licence in mercy.

**2** M NOTHING William Walssh of Ilkeston complains of John Westhall and both assessed by the court. Plea: debt. Put themselves in arbitration.

**3** M The jurors between Hugh Bladesmyth pl and Nicholas Bryd did not come: Thomas Wylford, John Hampton, John Pykhill, Nicholas Edmond, Richard Coo, John Okeley, Robert Stannesby, Thomas Tylton.

**4** RESPITE Ralph Stoyle in his own person and Richard Symkyn, by John Bate his attorney, come. Day given to the parties to the next [court] to hear their judgement as the court was not advised.

**Further forinsec pleas held on Thur after Michaelmas in the above year [2 Oct 1432].**

**5** [INQ] ... John Parson <np> in his own person complains of Reynald Duchesman of Loughborough, *wever*. Plea: trespass against the king's peace. He says that Reynald on Wed before the feast of St Barnabas 5 Henry VI [4 June 1427] with force and arms (staff) took and carried off a pair of wooden stocks (*stokes*) worth 6d. Damages: 12d. He produces suit. Reynald comes in his own person and says he is not guilty. Inq. Plgs: William Joly, John Ler. John np. In mercy.

**6** INQ M PLG PROS [JOHN] COST, RICHARD REST Robert Crane, by Cumbred Lere his attorney, complains of William Ellesworth jnr <licence>. Plea: debt of 8½d. He says that William owes and unjustly detains 8½d. outstanding on certain sheep bought [from him], which he should have paid at Michaelmas 11 Henry VI [29 Sept 1432]; he paid nothing but refused to pay and still refuses. Damages:

4d. He produces suit. William comes and defends the force and says he owes him nothing. Inq. William for a licence [in mercy].

**7** INQ ... Margaret Crag <np>, by John Ode her attorney, complains of William Rosse. Plea: trespass against the king's peace. She says that William on Wed after Michaelmas 11 Henry VI [1 Oct 1432] with force and arms (staff) beat, affrayed and maltreated Margaret. Damages: 20s. She produces suit. William in his own person comes and says he is not guilty. Inq. Margaret np. In mercy.

**8** [INQ] ... <plg pros: Ralph Stoye> William Rokes of Normanton on Soar in his own person complains of Thomas Mason of Radcliffe on Trent. Plea: trespass and contempt against the ordinance (1349) and statute of labourers. He says that Thomas at Michaelmas 9 Henry VI [29 Sept 1430] was retained with William to serve him for a year in husbandry (*husbandr*); on Mon after Michaelmas in the said year [2 Oct 1430] Thomas without reasonable cause and licence withdrew from William's service. Damages: 15s. He produces suit. Thomas in his own person comes and defends the force and says he was not retained nor withdrew from his service. Inq.

**9** [INQ] ... Robert Sheperde of Selston in his own person complains of Elizabeth widow of John Robert <essoin>. Plea: debt of 8s.10d. He says that Elizabeth from Whitsun 11<sup>1</sup> Henry VI [? 8 June 1432] to Christmas following [? 25 Dec 1432] hired [him] for 8s.10d. for the use and working of sea-coal pits (*ad opus pyteorum carbon' marit' ibidem operand'*), to be paid at Michaelmas following [? 29 Sept 1432]; she paid nothing but refused to pay and still refuses. Damages: 3s.4d. He produces suit. Elizabeth, by William Caunterbury her attorney, comes and defends the force and says she owes him nothing. Inq.

**10** [INQ] ... William Bradmere in his own person complains of Robert Wright of ...<sup>2</sup> <licence. Plg: John Alestre, *roper*>. Plea: debt of 5s. He says that William from Michaelmas 5 Henry VI [29 Sept 1426] leased a tenement to Robert, to hold from the said Michaelmas for a year, rendering for that year 6s.8d. at Easter [20 Apr 1427] and Michaelmas following [29 Sept 1427]. Robert satisfied William to the sum now in demand; he paid nothing but refused to pay and still refuses. Damages: 2s. He produces suit. Robert comes and defends the force and says he owes him nothing. Inq. [William] for a licence in mercy.

**11** [INQ] ... John Okeley in his own person <np. Plg: William Wode, *barbour*> complains of William Rosse of Nottingham, *sadeler*. Plea: trespass and contempt against the ordinance (1349) and statute of labourers. He says that William on Mon after the feast of St Denis 11 Henry VI [13 Oct 1432] was retained with John to serve him from the said Mon to the feast of the translation of St Edward following [18 Feb 1433] as a *sadeler*; on Tues after the feast of St Faith in the said year [7 Oct 1432] William without reasonable cause and licence withdrew from John's service. Damages: 3s.4d. He produces suit. William in his own person comes and defends the force and says he was not retained nor withdrew from his service. [Inq.] Plg: John Lokyngton, *sadeler*.

**12** [LEVY M] William Wright of Hollowstone (*Holoston*), by John Ode his attorney, complains of Nicholas Blacke of Nottingham. Plea: trespass and contempt against the ordinance (1349) and statute of labourers. He says that Nicholas on the feast of the invention of the HC 10 Henry VI [3 May 1432] for a year was retained with William as a carpenter (*carpentar*); on Tues after the feast of St Laurence [12 Aug 1432] Nicholas without reasonable cause withdrew from William's service. Damages: 20s. He produces suit. [Nicholas] comes in his own person and defends the force and acknowledges his retention. As to his withdrawal, he seeks the assessment of the court. ... In mercy. Precept to levy.

**13** [INQ] ... [Hugh] ... of Morton, Derbys, by John Ode his attorney, complains of John Hunt of Nuthall <essoyn, not paid>. Plea: debt of 12s. He says that [John] on Sat before Michaelmas 10 Henry VI [22 Sept 1431] bought 10 *gryndylstones* from Hugh for 12s., [to be paid] at the feast of St Martin following [11 Nov 1431]; he paid nothing but refused to pay and still refuses. Damages: 3s.4d. [He produces] suit. John, by William Midilton his attorney, comes and defends the force and acknowledges 10s. In mercy. As to 2s., he says he owes him nothing. Inq. Plg: Henry Peyntour.

**14** [INQ] ... William Bradmere of Nottingham in his own person complains of Simon Porter of Nottingham <essoyn>. Plea: debt of 3s.4d. He says that Richard Deeken of Nottingham on Sat after Michaelmas 10 Henry VI [6 Oct 1431] borrowed from William 3s.4d., to be paid at Michaelmas following [29 Sept 1432]. For greater security Simon became the pledger and fidejussor of Richard to

William and agreed to pay 3s.4d. if Richard should not pay; he paid nothing by which the action accrued to William to seek 3s.4d. v Simon; he paid nothing. Damages: 2s. He produces suit. Simon, by William C[aunderbury] his attorney, comes and defends the force and says he owes him nothing. Inq.

**15** [M] Robert Crane, by Gunifrid Lere his attorney, complains of William Ellesworth jnr <+, acknowledges>. Plea: debt of 2s. Defaulted. William comes and acknowledges. Damages assessed at 2d. In mercy.

**16** [M] William Wright of Hollowstone (*Holoston*) <np> in his own person complains of William Grene. Plea: trespass against the king's peace. William Wright np.

**17** [M] John Fossebrook, *bochor*, complains of William Neelson <licence>. Plea: debt. William for a licence in mercy.

**18** ... John Ireland of Nottingham, by John Ode his attorney, complains of Robert Lowe of Ruddington <3+, Thur, licence>. Plea: debt of 5s. Summoned against the first hour on Fri. Robert charged. Did not appear. Defaulted. Precept to the bailiffs that they should place Robert by gage (*vad'*) and safe pledgers against the first [hour] on Sat following. Robert charged. Did not appear. Defaulted. The bailiffs return that Robert has nothing within their bailliwick by which they are able to distrain. Precept to the bailiffs to take Robert and have his body from the day [of the feast] of the translation of St Edward in 3 weeks [? 4 Dec 1432] to reply to John Ireland in the said plea.

**19** [INQ] ... William Wade of Nottingham, by John Ode his attorney, complains of William Pullayn of Nottingham, *wever*. Plea: trespass and contempt against the ordinance (1349) and statute of labourers. He says that Katherine Pullayn at Easter 10 Henry VI [20 Apr 1432] was retained with William Wade to serve him from Easter for a year in housewifery (*huswyfrie*); on Tues after the feast of St John of Beverley in the said year [13 May 1432] William Pullayn retained and received Katherine, William Wade's servant, in his service. Damages: 40s. He produces suit. William Pullayn in his own person comes and defends the force and says he did not receive his servant for a long time. Inq.

**21** M Nicholas Brydde of Nottingham for a licence to agree with Hugh Bladesmyth pl in mercy. Plea: trespass.

**22** [LEVY] M Found by inq that Thomas Mason of Radcliffe on Trent was retained with Robert Rokes of Normanton on Soar and that Thomas withdrew from his service. As after a year and a day, adjudged that William should recover v Thomas 12d. for his damages. In mercy.

**23** M Found by inq that William Pullayn is not guilty v William Wade. Adjudged that William Wade should recover nothing v William Pullayn but for his unjust suit in mercy.

**24** [INQ] ... Thomas Abbote of Colwick <plg pros: John Ewer>, by William Caunterbury his attorney, complains of Thomas Sharp of Cropwell <7+, licence>. Plea: trespass. He says that Thomas Abbote on Sat before the feast of St Laurence 10 Henry VI [9 Aug 1432] bought a moiety of a quarter of good and fit first-grade malt from Thomas Sharp under the warranty of Thomas Sharp for ...<sup>3</sup> Thomas Sharp on the same day sold a moiety of a quarter of malt (*bras' ordeñ rawe jeket* and with *weselys spevelled'*, as has been fully verified, and by the consumption of ale made thereafter when drunk men could not hold it nor digest it as fully demonstrated [and] killed pigs, a cockerel and capons (*cum sumeretur ab hominibus non potuit teneri nec cum eis digestare plene comprobatur porcos gallum campones inde interfecti fuerunt ut supra*). Damages: 20s. He produces suit. Thomas Sharp in his own person comes and defends the force and says he is not guilty. Inq. Plgs: Thomas Yvenet, John Esthwayt.

**25** [INQ] ... Robert Baseford in his own person complains of John Okeley <essoin>. Plea: debt of 2s.8d. He says that John on Sat the eve of Whitsun 10 Henry VI [7 June 1432] bought 6 calf skins (*cor' vitul'*) for 2s.8d. from Robert, to be paid at Trinity Sun following [15 June 1432]; he paid nothing but refused to pay and still refuses. Damages: 12d. He produces suit. John in his own person comes and defends the force and says he owes him nothing. Inq.

**26** INQ PLG PROS [JOHN] WENT, [ADAM] FENT <rests> Richard Clowdham of Clifton in his own person complains of William servant of William Lemeryng of Nottingham. Plea: trespass against the king's peace. He says that William the servant on Wed after the feast of the purification of the BVM 9 Henry VI [7 Feb 1431] with force and arms (staff) made an assault on Joan, Richard's wife, affrayed, strangled *et cum ea vitis [?] dentibus suis concubint'*. Damages: 40s. He produces suit. William the servant in his own person comes and says he is not guilty. Inq. Plgs: William Lemeryng, William Bradmere.

**27** [INQ PLG] PROS [JOHN] WEST, [ADAM] EST John Plumptre of Nottingham in his own person complains of Trystram Foljambe <essoin>. Plea: debt of 23s.4d. He says that Trystram owes and unjustly detains 23s.4d. for the rent of a house leased to him and now in arrears for ...<sup>4</sup> years, which Trystram should have paid at Michaelmas last [29 Sept 1432]; he paid nothing but refused to pay and still refuses. Damages: 3s.4d. He produces suit. Trystram in his own person comes and defends the force and says he owes him nothing. Inq.

**28** INQ [PLG] PROS [JOHN] HERT, [ADAM] SUERT <rests> John Fossebrook of Nottingham, *bochor* <essoin>, by William Midilton his attorney, complains of Reynald Shagh of Eastwood. Plea: debt of 13s.8d. He says that Reynald owes and unjustly detains 13s.8d.: 8s. for half an ox and 5s.8d. for tallow (*pro sepe*) bought from him, which Reynald should have paid at the feast of the nativity of St John the Baptist 10 Henry VI [24 June 1432]; he paid nothing but refused to pay and still refuses. Damages: 3s.4d. He produces suit. Reynald comes in his own person and defends the force and says he owes him nothing. Inq.

**29** INQ PLG PROS HENRY HUNT, WILLIAM PUNT <rests> William Benette in his own person complains of Adam Hayton, *taillour*. Plea: trespass against the king's peace. He says that Adam, with John his son, on Sat the feast of St Luke 11

Henry VI [18 Oct 1432] with force and arms (staff) took and led away Agnes his servant (*servient*). Damages: 20s. He produces suit. Adam in his own person comes and says he is not guilty. Inq.

**30** INQ [PLG] PROS [JOHN] REST, [ADAM] EST <John Clowdham as above, rests> Robert Hodynette of Radcliffe in his own person complains of William Rokes of Normanton. Plea: trespass. He says that William on Sat before the feast of St Luke 11 Henry VI [11 Oct 1432] unjustly arrested and imprisoned Thomas Mason his servant so that his service was lost to him for a long time. Damages: 6s.8d. He produces suit. William comes in his own person and defends the force and says he is not guilty. Inq.

**31** INQ PLG PROS JOHN WENT, RICHARD REST Richard Lorymer of Lenton, by John Ode his attorney, complains of John Lokyngton, *sadeler* <essoin>. Plea: debt of 3s.2d. He says that John on Sat before Whitsun 10 Henry VI [7 June 1432] bought from Richard for 3s.2d. iron *moleynes stiropes*, to be paid at the feast of the nativity St John the Baptist following; he paid nothing but refused to pay and still refuses. Damages: 12d. He produces suit. John in his own person comes and defends the force and says he owes him nothing. Inq.

**32** INQ PLG PROS JOHN HUNT, WILLIAM PUNT <rests> John Martyn and William Martyn of Colwick, by William Midilton their attorney, complain of William Node of Colwick. Plea: trespass against the ordinance (1349) and statute of labourers. They say that William Node on the feast of the nativity of St John the Baptist 10 Henry VI [24 June 1432] to Michaelmas following [29 Sept 1432] was retained with John and William Martyn to carry sea coals (*ad cariland' carbon' matrit*); on Tues after the feast of St Peter and St Paul in the said year [1 July 1432] William Node without reasonable cause and licence withdrew from their service. Damages: 13s.4d. They produce suit. William Node in his own person comes and defends the force and says he was not retained nor withdrew from [their] service. Inq.

**33** [INQ] ... John Balthwayt jnr in his own person complains of Thomas Eyton <essoin>. Plea: debt of 6s. He says that Thomas on Wed after ... the feast of the nativity of St John the Baptist 10 Henry VI [25 June 1432] bought a horse from John for 6s., to be paid at Michaelmas following [29 Sept 1432]; he paid nothing [but] refused to pay and still refuses. Damages: 12d. He produces suit. Thomas,

by William Midilton [his] attorney [comes] and defends the force and says he owes him nothing. Inq.

**34** [INQ] ... Henry Burley of Sulby, by Thomas Goldsmyth his attorney, complains of John Okeley, *sadeler*, of Nottingham <licence>. Plea: debt of 4s.4d. [He says] that John owes and unjustly detains 4s.4d. outstanding on a woman's (*mulieb*) robe, a chest (*arche*), a spinning wheel (*spynnyngwhele*) and a *wyniiiiie* of iron bought on Thur after the feast of the invention of the HC 10 Henry VI [8 May 1432], which Henry should have paid at Whitsun following [8 June 1432]; he paid nothing but refused to pay and still refuses. Damages: 2s. He produces suit. John in his own person comes and defends the force and says he owes him nothing. Inq. John for a licence in mercy.

**35** [INQ] ... Tailliour of Nottingham, by William C[aunderbury] his attorney, complains of William Node [of] Colwick. Plea: debt of 12d. He says that he owes and unjustly detains 12d. for altering (*sinacione*) lined clothes (*vestment' duplicat'*) for his boys (*pueris suis*), which William should have paid at Michaelmas 10 Henry VI [29 Sept 1431]; he paid nothing but refused to pay and still refuses. Damages: 6d. He produces suit. William in his own person comes and defends the force and says he owes him nothing. Inq.

**36** [INQ] ... John Crophull, *skynner*, of Nottingham <np> in his own person complains of Thomas Osbern of Nottingham. Plea: trespass against the king's peace. He says that Thomas on Fri after the feast of St Luke 11 Henry VI [24 Oct 1432] with force and arms (staff) took and carried off 4 black sheep skins well tawed (*pell' ov' nigr' bene tawiat'*) worth 10d. Damages: 3s.4d. He produces [suit]. Thomas in his own person comes and says he is not guilty. Inq.

**37** [INQ] ... John Manchestre, by John Ode his attorney, complains of William Node of Colwick <essoin>. Plea: that he should return to him 8 cart[loads] of charcoal (*carreatat' carbon'*) worth 26s.8d. which he owes and unjustly detains; unjustly because William ought to have returned the 8 cartloads on Mon after the feast of the nativity of St John the Baptist 10 Henry VI [30 June 1432]; he refused to return and still refuses. Damages: 10s. He produces suit. William in his own person comes and defends the force and says he owes him nothing. Inq.



**38** INQ PLG PROS JOHN COST, THOMAS FORSTER The same John Manchestre, by the said attorney, complains of the said William <essoin>. Plea: trespass. He complains that William on Mon after the feast of St Hilary 10 Henry VI [14 Jan 1432] so chased and ran with his dog John's swan (*signum*) called *eyrer* that the swan was killed. Damages: 100s. He produces suit. William in his own person comes and defends the force and says he is not guilty. Inq.

**39** INQ M M PLG PROS JOHN KENT, JOHN COST Simon Leyke of Wainfleet, *fyssher*, by John Ode his attorney, complains of William Webster of Ruddington <licence. Plg: Thomas Coryour>. Plea: debt of 15s. He says that William on Sat before the feast of St Martin 10 Henry VI [10 Nov 1431] bought fish worth 15s. from Simon, to be paid at the feast of the purification of the BVM following [2 Feb 1432]; he paid nothing but refused to pay and still refuses. Damages: 6s.8d. He produces suit. William in his own person comes and defends the force and acknowledges 6s.8d. Damages assessed at 6d. In mercy. As to 6s.8d., he says he owes him nothing. Inq. William Webster as to 6s.8d. for a licence in mercy.

**40** INQ [PLG] PROS [ADAM] FOX, JOHN [COST] John Kent of Nottingham and Agnes his wife complain of William Webster of Ruddington <licence. Plg: Thomas Coryour>. Plea: debt of 2s.6d. They say that William on Sat after the feast of St Martin 10 Henry VI [17 Nov 1431] bought from John and Agnes 7 yards of haircloth (*del hayre*) for 2s.6d., to be paid at Christmas following [25 Dec 1431]; he paid nothing but refused to pay and still refuses. Damages: 12d. They produce suit. William in his own person comes and defends the force and says he owes him nothing. Inq. Immediately comes Thomas Coryour and became the pledger and fidejussor of William to pay 8s.4d. to Simon of the bailiffs in the other suits.

**42** M NOTHING Joan Tyllnyges complains of Richard Plomer. Plea: debt. Joan np. In mercy.

**44** M John Gedney, clerk, in his own person complains of Thomas Hawkeburn. Plea: trespass [and] contempt. Thomas for a licence in mercy.

He says that Isabella on Tues after the feast of St Luke 11 Henry VI [21 Oct 1432] with force and arms (staff) took and carried off a maslin basin (*pelveni masl'*) worth 8d. Damages: 2s. He produces suit. Isabella in her own person comes and says she is not guilty. Inq.

**47** [INQ] M M [PLG] PROS [JOHN] FOX, [JOHN] HERT John Manchestre, by John Ode his attorney, complains of John Chapman of Sneinton <+, acknowledges, paid>. Plea: debt of 40s. He says that John Manchestre on Sat before the feast of St Laurence 10 Henry VI [9 Aug 1432] leased the tithes of hay of Sneinton vill to John Chapman for 40s., to be paid at Michaelmas following [29 Sept 1432]; he paid nothing but refused to pay and still refuses. Damages: 13s.4d. He produces suit. John Chapman in his own person comes and defends the force and acknowledges 17d. In mercy. As to the rest, he says he owes him nothing. Inq. Plg: John Morewode.

**48** INQ M ... John Wolaton of Nottingham in his own person complains of Robert Smyth of Bellar Gate (*Belwardgate*) <licence>. Plea: trespass against the king's peace. He says that Robert on Tues after Michaelmas 11 Henry VI [30 Sept 1432] with force and arms (staff) broke, threw down the walls (*parietes*) of John's house and arrested divers goods and chattels for the rent of the house, took and carried off 2 iron keys worth 2d. and 7 wooden spars (*sparres*) worth 12d. Damages: 10s. He produces suit. John in his own person comes and says he is not guilty. Inq. Robert for a licence [in mercy].

Plea: trespass and contempt against the ordinance and statute of labourers. He says that Robert on the feast of St Crispin and St Crispian 11 Henry VI [25 Oct 1432] to the feast of St Martin following [11 Nov 1432] was retained with William as a thresher (*ad offic' tritircacionis*); on Sun before the feast of St Simon and St Jude in the said year [26 Oct 1432] Robert without reasonable cause and licence withdrew from William's service. Damages: 3s.4d. He produces suit. Robert in his own person comes and defends the force and says he is not guilty. Inq.<sup>6</sup> Robert Skelton for a licence in mercy.

**51** [INQ M PLG] PROS [JOHN] HUNT, [ADAM] PUNT John Turnour of Underwood, by William Caunterbury his attorney, complains of John Jamesson <essoin>. Plea: debt of 5s.9d. He says that John Jamesson owes and unjustly detains 5s.9d. for pigs bought from John Turnour, which he should have paid on the feast of St Peter advincola 10 Henry VI [1 Aug 1432]; he paid nothing but refused to pay and still refuses.
