

Recreating saved queries and alerts in NUsearch

You should have taken a screenshot or made a note of exactly what search you saved in your old eShelf

Make sure you sign in to NUsearch, and then re-create and run each search exactly as you have recorded.

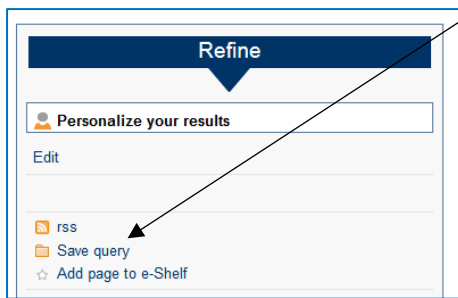
For example, a simple search for the exact phrase “global warming”:

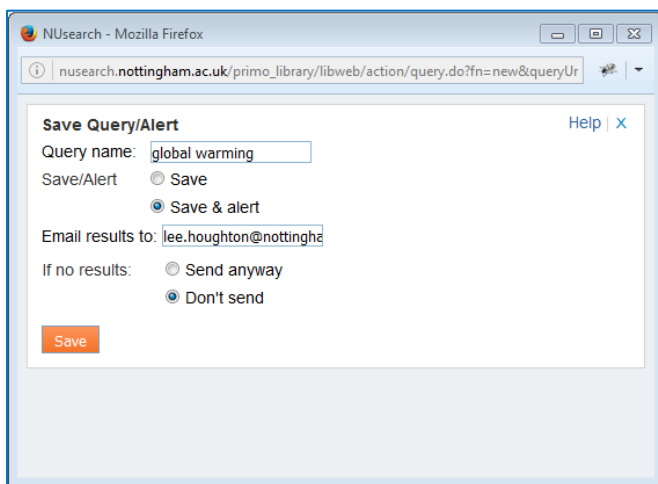
