Competition Rules

Submissions are welcome from any nmRC user or associate where the following criteria apply:

- ⇒ Samples, sample data or other related content must have been worked on / created at the nmRC
- ⇒ Entries are submitted to nmrcenquiries@nottingham.ac.uk along with the following:
 - Name of entrant (+ name of supervisor if postgraduate/ undergraduate)
 - Title of entry (feel free to be creative!)
 - Brief description of entry (what it actually is)
- ⇒ Nothing confidential will be contained within the submission
- ⇒ Maximum number of submissions per person = 3
- ⇒ Applicants must be happy that entries and associated details may be used in subsequent nmRC imagery
- ⇒ In the case of postgraduate / undergraduate submissions, permission must be obtained by your supervisor to submit an entry (with confirmation content can be shared)
- ⇒ nmRC staff are ineligible for this competition





Further Guidance

The following additional guidance may be of use:

- ⇒ Content is not restricted to images alone, and other content can be considered i.e., videos, aminations, graphical data etc.
- ⇒ Samples or sample data can be related to any of the techniques or labs at the nmRC.
- → Other appropriate content relating more directly to the instrumentation or facilities is acceptable.
- ⇒ Contestants are welcome to manipulate and/or enhance their content i.e. adding extra features, false colouring, filtering etc. as the content is solely for artistic purposes.
- ⇒ Entries will be judged primarily on their artistic merit and originality.
- ⇒ Entries can be made on behalf of multiple parties but any prizes awarded to such an entry would be split evenly between entrants.
- ⇒ Entries will be judged by a select panel of nmRC staff with a shortlist then being voted on by the entire staffing.
- No further entries will be accepted after the 20/05/2022
