Overview

The University of Nottingham offers a portfolio of masters courses focussing on the psychology of work, organisations and management for those looking to advance their careers in psychology, management, consulting, human resources or research.

The MSc Occupational Psychology, MSc Work and Organisational Psychology and MSc Management Psychology will equip you to design and improve the way an organisation selects, develops and manages people. You will also learn to design, conduct and write up a real-world research project.

Content

The **MSc Occupational Psychology** focuses on:

- Learning, training and development
- Psychological assessment at work
- Leadership motivation and engagement
- Wellbeing and work
- Work design, organisational change and development
- Research design, advanced data gathering and analytical techniques
- Applying psychology to work and organisations
- Development of consultancy skills

The **MSc Work and Organisational Psychology** mirrors the MSc Occupational Psychology. Students on both courses undertake lectures together.

The **MSc Management Psychology**:

- Begins with an introduction to the psychological concepts central to management and the workplace
- Does not assume prior knowledge of research methods or statistical tests
- Emphasises strategic management and workplace diversity
- Develops consultancy skills

All three courses give you the opportunity to obtain an additional European Test User Qualification in occupational ability and personality testing.

In the summer term, you will undertake an applied research project, which is a piece of real-world research that can be carried out in any part of the world.

All courses are offered on either a full or part-time basis. Both mature students and recent graduates are encouraged to apply.

Entry requirements

MSc Occupational Psychology

An undergraduate degree in psychology (2:1 or above) that confers the graduate basis for chartership (GBC).

MSc Work and Organisational Psychology

An undergraduate degree (2:1 or above) with psychology as a major or minor subject that is not accredited by the BPS.

MSc Management Psychology

An undergraduate degree in a discipline other than psychology.

If your first language is not English you must achieve an overall IELTS score of at least 6.5 with no less than 6.0 in each element for all three masters programmes.
