During Easter 2024 the public engagement team and historian Dr Sarah Holland hosted a project to co-create a sound trail on campus. Working alongside SparkStem we recruited six participants to help us plan this trail. We walked in the rain, photographed nature, inspected original documents, created scripts, recorded clips, had a go at coding and reimagined the landscape.

The resulting trail takes you to four sound stations, visiting lesser known places of interest on the way. The stations feature voices from the group, introducing you to characters from the past and highlighting some of the activity that happens here now.

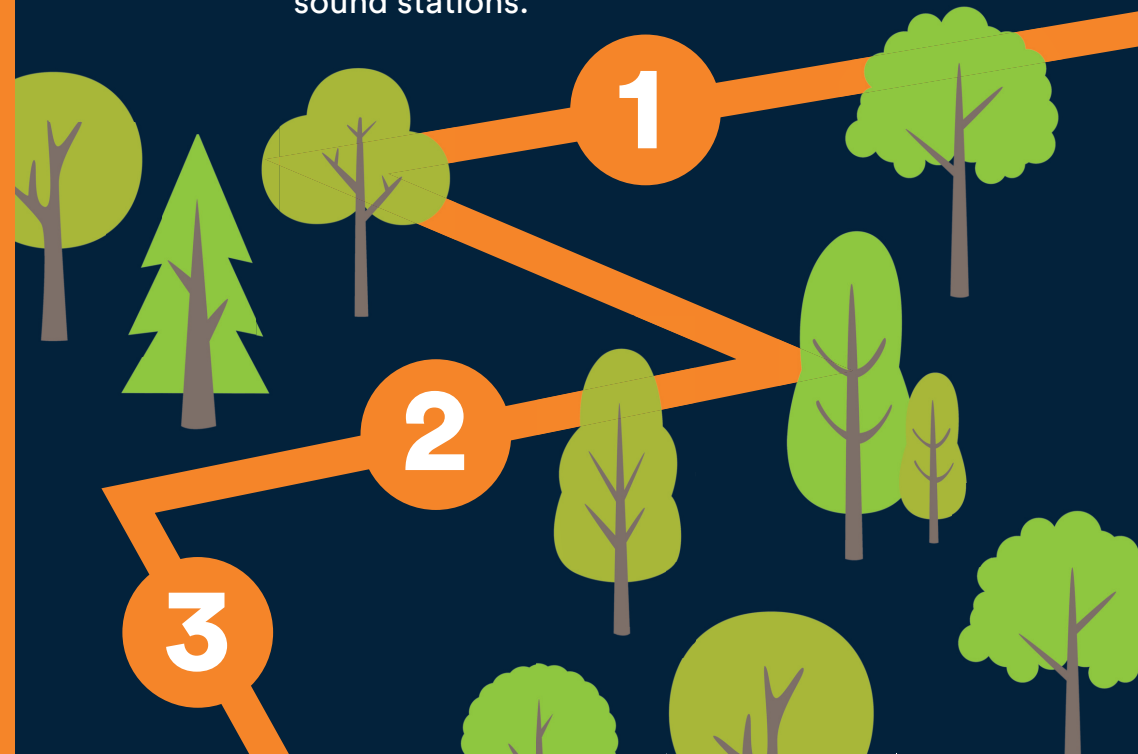

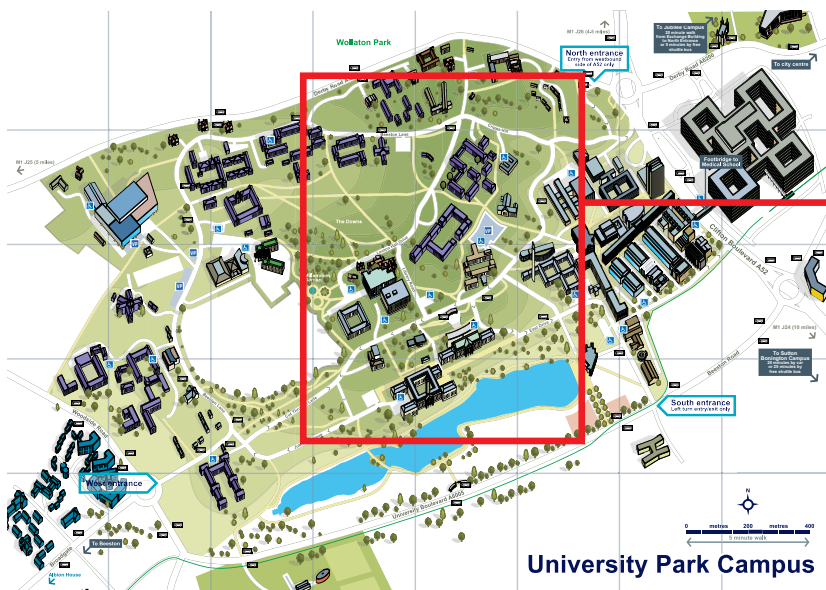
