This is an invitation to take part in a research study on driving behaviour. Before you decide if you wish to take part, it is important for you to understand why the research is being done and what it will involve. Please take time to read the following information carefully.

If you participate you will be asked to complete a series of driving tasks in our driving simulator. In total there are three parts to this study (each lasting no longer than 1 hour). You can complete parts 1 and 2 within the same session, or all three parts can be completed on different days.

In the simulator you will complete a number of different drives which will involve you driving towards a junction, or driving along a straight road. Before the main driving tasks, you will be given a practice drive to allow you to get used to the simulator, and allow the researcher to check for any signs of simulator sickness (similar to motion sickness). If you experience any discomfort or sickness at any point, you should inform the experimenter who will stop the experiment immediately. If you experience no discomfort, you will continue with the remainder of the study. Each of the three sessions will last approximately one hour, with the entire study lasting approximately three hours.

Participation in this study is totally voluntary, and you are under no obligation to take part. You are free to withdraw at any point before or during the study. All data collected will be kept confidential and used for research purposes only. It will be stored in compliance with the Data Protection Act.
