
PILOT STUDY

- Training was delivered to 5 police forces Leicestershire,
 Nottinghamshire, Northamptonshire, Gwent and Lincolnshire
- Total of 18 sessions between September 2019 and Feb 2020
- Sessions lasted between 45 minutes and 2 hours 30 minutes
- 142 individuals attended the sessions
- Mainly aimed at sergeants including custody, response and police













Average change in knowledge for groups with different prior levels of understanding of autism



Knowledge level before significantly correlated with change in knowledge due to training. N=140; p=.000, r=.795

COPRODUCTION IN CRIMINAL JUSTICE

LEARNING POINTS

- Increased transparency
- More frequent updates about what is going on in the project
- Better structures for providing verbal feedback
- Sharing feedback
- Providing more time to complete on individual opportunities to give feedback in advance
- More time to complete the project

LEARNING POINTS

- Strength and benefits of working together
- Be open to having assumptions challenged
- How to facilitate autistic involvement
- Opportunity to hear the perspectives of others and learn about new contexts
- Importance of including all affected
