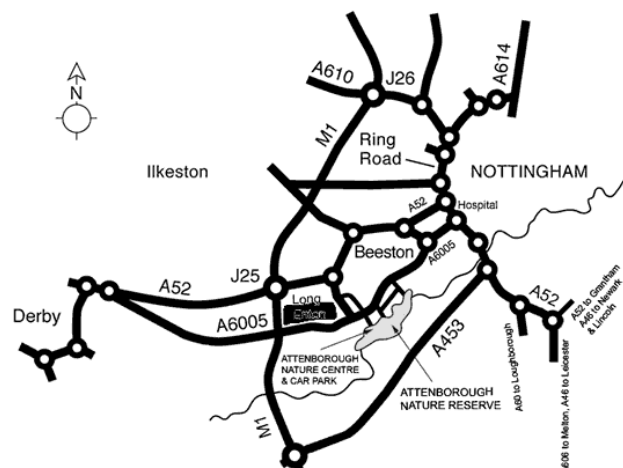
How to get to Attenborough Nature Reserve

Via car

The nature reserve is situated just 3.5 miles from J25 of the M1, off the A6005 between Beeston and Long Eaton. From the A6005 turn onto Barton Lane at the traffic lights at Chilwell Retail Park. Take the second exit at the roundabout and the car park is at the bottom of the road, over the railway crossing.

Via rail

The venue is 6 miles from Nottingham Train Station and 2 miles from Beeston Train Station.

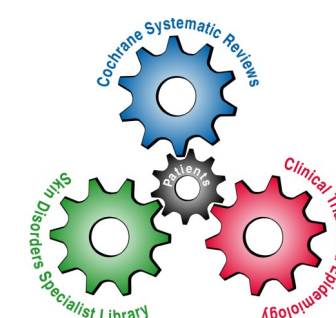

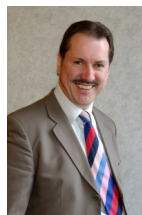
