From Nottingham and Beeston

By train

The nearest stations are located in Nottingham City Centre or Beeston. Taxis and buses are available at both stations.

By bus or tram

There are a number of bus services running from Nottingham to University Park Campus. Please see the [bus services page](#) for further information.

There is now [a tram](#) from Nottingham Railway Station, accessible by the walkway leading from the station. Tickets must be purchased before boarding. The Toton line takes you directly to the University and visitors should disembark at the University of Nottingham stop.

By taxi

There are taxi ranks throughout the city and immediately adjacent to the main railway and bus stations. The journey to the campus takes approximately 15 minutes.

From East Midlands Airport

From East Midlands Airport you can take the Trent Barton Indigo service directly to the campus or the Skylink bus to Nottingham. Buses leave from outside the Airport Arrivals hall. See [bus services for further information](#).

You can also take a direct taxi to the University. The cost of a single/one way journey is approximately £20.

From M1 motorway

Leave the M1 motorway at Junction 25 to join the A52 to Nottingham. Follow the A52 for approximately 4 miles, at the Toby Carvery roundabout turn right onto the A6464, turn left at the next roundabout to enter the University's West Entrance.
