

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Health and wellbeing boards

- Every 'upper tier' local authority has set up a Health & Wellbeing Board
- intended to:
 - increase democratic input into strategic decisions about health and wellbeing services
 - strengthen working relationships between health and social care
 - encourage integrated commissioning of health and social care services

Objective 6: Community personal support services

- Two-thirds of people with dementia live in their own homes
- Helping people with dementia to stay in their own homes for longer
- Personal budgets

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Why is dementia a priority in Nottinghamshire?

9805 adults over 65 in Nottinghamshire currently have dementia


Increases to over 18,000 adults in 2030

88% increase 2010-2030

45% of people have a formal diagnosis

Two thirds of people with dementia live at home = 6500

Joint Strategic Needs Assessment (JSNA)



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
What have we achieved so far in Nottinghamshire?

- **Early diagnosis and support**
 - Revised GP referral guidelines
 - Implemented new Memory Assessment Service
 - Additional social support for people newly diagnosed
- **Living Well with dementia**
 - Mental Health Intermediate Care Service
 - Assistive Technology – ‘Just Checking’
 - Care Homes
 - Staff training, including awareness and end of life issues
 - Dementia Outreach Service county-wide
 - Quality monitoring includes dementia care
 - Improved services for inpatients in acute wards

Mental Health Intermediate Care

- Nottinghamshire County model is intensive home treatment developed as an alternative to hospital beds
 - Rushcliffe Team in place since 2008
 - All teams will be in place by mid 2013
- Service specification includes:
 - Will commission services to meet long-term care needs
 - Improve capability and quality in mainstream home care or day care services through the provision of a specialist outreach liaison service offering advice, support, training and education
- Each team sees about 130 people pa
- Evaluation shows
 - 75% still at home 90 days after discharge
 - 67% still at home 180 days after discharge
