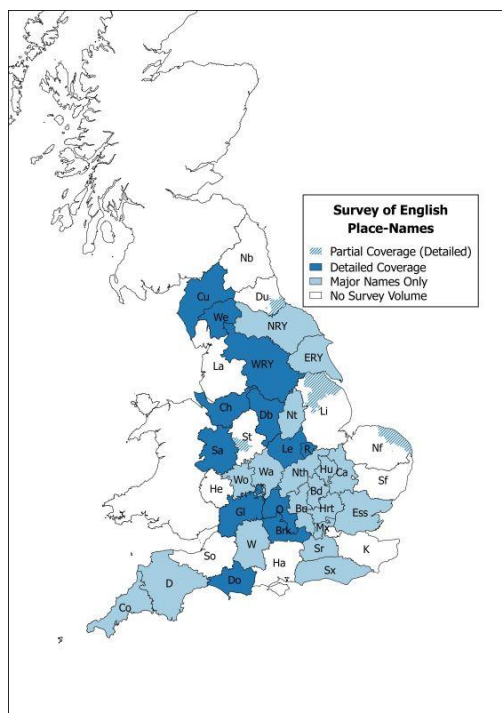

Many record offices have a subscription to *The Genealogist*, <https://www.thegenealogist.co.uk/> [accessed April 2025]. This digital resource has a map interface and has digitised all tithe maps for the country. As with all these maps, clicking on individual plots generates a pop-up giving details of the name. It is also possible to download copies of the maps and corresponding awards.

Some record offices have transcribed tithe awards into spreadsheets, which are easier to search and sort. They have also made available shapefiles, giving the polygons for the tithe plots, for use in a GIS programme.
