NBCRC Research Seminar Series

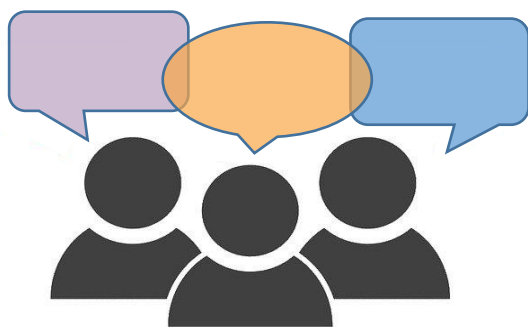

Short talks by patients are always incredibly well received – not only do they help to raise awareness of breast cancer to the general public, they are so motivational for research scientists working to find new and better treatments for the disease.

NBCRC continues to fund novel BC research - Pilot Grants 2021

Despite a significant hit in fundraising income during the Covid pandemic, NBCRC have been able to continue to run the annual pilot grant process. This is all thanks to the wonderful support we have had from all our supporters over the last couple of years.

Thank you to all the researchers who submitted an application to this years Pilot Grant round – the standard of application was excellent. The initial triage process has been completed and the top 5 projects are out for full review by a panel of national breast cancer experts. The successful projects will be announced in the next issue.
