#### SUMMARY OF EVENT

The event consisted of two days of enlightening discussions at the Medical School, QMC.

- Day One was our public event where patients gave some heartfelt, motivational talks about their journeys and experiences with breast cancer. These talks really struck a chord with the researchers and the importance of their efforts became more meaningful. They also inspired the patients and families in the audience and gave them something to relate to. Breast cancer researchers gave general overviews of their work and the progress that is being made.

- Day Two was our research awareness event with a presentation from our guest speaker, Adrian Harris, from the University of Oxford. Then followed talks from Novartis Pharmaceuticals and researchers and clinicians. The day was attended by academics, clinicians, radiologists, nurses and students.

Congratulations to Kwok-Leung Cheung and Anna Grabowska on their promotion to Professor and Alan McIntyre on his promotion to Associate Professor.

Professor Ian Ellis has been awarded the 1st Larry Norton Award for Excellence in Breast Pathology at the International Society of Breast Pathology/USCAP meeting in the United States.



Professor Madhusudan has been awarded the First 'Lady Estelle Wolfson Lecturership in Translational Medicine' by the Royal College of Physicians of London. This is in recognition of translational breast cancer research focussed on DNA repair that his group is undertaking in Nottingham.
