Results are in! – NBCRC Pilot Grant call 2020

Thanks to donations made by our wonderful supporters and fundraisers NBCRC is able to support 3 further projects under our pilot grant scheme.

Each project will receive £10K to fund novel breast cancer research for a 12 month period. Data obtained through pilot projects can be vital to securing larger grants from other funding bodies, to support the ongoing research.

The application process involved a rigorous review by breast cancer specialists and patients across the UK to ensure that the best projects are funded. Congratulations to this years recipients. The successful projects are:

Tracey Bradshaw	Investigating in vivo efficacy of apoferitin-encapsulated antitumour benzothiazole 5F203 against human-derived breast cancer xenografts
Victoria James	Uncovering how triple negative breast cancer communicates to nearby non-cancer cells in order to mediate treatment resistance
Stewart Martin	Understanding calpastatin's role in regulating breast cancer metastasis

You will be able to hear more from the project leaders during October (Breast Cancer Awareness month) when NBCRC will deliver a series of short online presentations, open to the public.

Update on Pilot Grants from 2019

Although there are many aspects of research that our members can continue at home Covid-19 has had a significant impact on laboratory based work. There has been no access to laboratories since the end of March and although a return to the building is in progress, this is a gradual and phased operation to ensure safe working practices.

It is for this reason that the duration of our 2019 pilot grant awards has been extended. This will give the project teams the opportunity to complete their planned research and generate valuable data that will help us to further understand breast cancer and work towards new and improved treatments.

A reminder of these projects, also funded entirely by your generous support is given below. These projects, together with the 3 new awards will continue until end of Sept 2021. Updates will be provided throughout the year but the project leads will also present their progress at our Oct online event.

S Madhusudan	Targeting Replication protein A (RPA) for personalization of breast cancer therapy
Judith Rammage	Tissue Resident immune cells in Breast Cancer
