## Boobie Date midnight golf tournament

Morley Hayes golf academy in Derbyshire made headline news this week as they became the first golf facility to reopen as lockdown restrictions were relaxed. The first golfers were all set to tee off just seconds after midnight on March 29, with glow in the dark golf balls and floodlit greens.

This late night charity tournament was organised by James Whatley, Head PGA Professional in memory of his sister Janine Brook. Following her own diagnosis of breast cancer, Janine launched the Boobie Date campaign, urging adults to check their breasts on the same date each month with the aim of detecting any changes early.

As well as raising awareness of the disease and the importance of self-examination the event raised over £2,500 for NBCRC and made news headlines across the UK.

What a fantastic event and a huge thank you to James for his ongoing support. The donation will make a huge difference to our ability to continue vital breast cancer research.



## Nelsons Law support NBCRC
