NBCRC Members & Research Updates

We are delighted to welcome the following new associate members to The Nottingham Breast Cancer Research community.

Khushboo Pathania, Commonwealth Split-site PhD Scholar, supervised by Dr Andy Green

Khushboo's research explores the role of metabolic reprogramming in breast cancer cells as a survival mechanism to sustain rapid growth, a phenomenon known as the Warburg effect. Her focus is on targeting the enzyme lactate dehydrogenase (LDH), which drives this altered metabolism, aiming to disrupt cancer energy production and suppress tumour growth.

Saskia Withington, MRes Researcher, supervised by Dr Sarah Storr

Saskia's research will aim to establish a more physiologically relevant 3D model to provide further understanding into the molecular mechanisms underlying breast cancer colonising bone. She aim to achieve this through the development of 3D printed trabecular bone scaffolds with human mesenchymal stromal cells to support co-culture systems involving multiple breast cancer cell lines.

Anum Malik, supervised by Dr Sarah Storr and Dr Dong Hyun Kim

Anum is a PhD researcher in the School of Pharmacy, focusing on investigating tumour metabolic heterogeneity and the tumour microenvironment using single-cell metabolomics and advanced mass spectrometry imaging techniques.

PhD Studentship

We will be welcoming our first fully funded NBCRC PhD Student starting in 2026. We have, following rigorous external peer review, selected the research projects that the chosen student will select from:

Dr Daniel Booth - The Ki-67 reload: Investigating novel links between the mitotic chromosome periphery, cell division fidelity and breast cancer.

Dr Judith Ramage - A multi-omics spatial approach to characterise and define the tumour immune microenvironment in UK and African triple negative breast cancer patients and the effects on their prognosis.


