"- We are so grateful for the treatment we have had available to us which was only possible through research and raising funds is a way we can give back.

- It is also a challenge for us individually to be fit enough to complete a walk that our treatment had made us all too ill to do. It is a part of recovery to have a physical activity to work towards and complete. The fund raising helps to make it an even bigger achievement

MEET A MEMBER

CINZIA ALLEGUCCI

WHO AM I? I am an Associate Professor in Cancer and Stem Cell Biology.

MY RESEARCH I have been working in breast cancer research over the last 11 years. My research focuses on understanding how stem cells within the mammary tissue become cancerous. In the normal mammary gland, stem cell proliferation is tightly regulated and occurs under the influence of pregnancy hormones. However in cancer, stem cells proliferation becomes unregulated due to aberrant expression of genes which lead to tumour growth. My group investigates the molecular mechanisms responsible of this aberrant gene regulation and devises therapeutic strategies to reverse them to bring cancer cells back under normal growth control. My research contributes to the development of effective therapies for breast cancer and to new ways of disease management..



OUTSIDE WORK I spend time outside work with my family, husband Ramiro and son Luca (5 years old).

INTERESTING FACT I love nature, animals, and travelling. I am a terrible runner but I will always do it for an important cause.
